"The *Popular Culture:* Rock and Pop Memorabilia sale saw an over-flowing saleroom of collectors and music fans of all ages bidding on a wide selection of music memorabilia items. Many bid and bought over the telephones and through Christie's LIVE, amounting to one of the strongest results for online bidding ever seen at Christie's South Kensington, with 42% of lots either bought or directly underbid online. Interest came from over 19 countries around the world, with bidders as far a field as Australia, Lebanon, Austria, South Africa and the Americas, amongst others.

We were particularly delighted with the result achieved for the largest collection of The Who memorabilia ever sold at auction, which exceeded expectations and fetched a total of $\pounds 169,946 / \$254,239 / \pounds 205,975$ (lots 130-187). The collection included 57 lots ranging from guitars and posters, to awards, amps and signed items.

The vendors, American collectors Brad and Diana Rodgers commented after the sale: "My wife and I were incredibly pleased with the results achieved by Christie's today. This sale demonstrates that the market for high end, one of a kind material is as strong as it has ever been.
