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## UPCOMING COURSES FROM CHRISTIE'S EDUCATION NEW YORK OPEN DOORS TO CONTEMPORARY ART, FINE JEWELRY

### New Short Course in Global Contemporary Art Complements Christie's New 15-Month Master's Degree Program

**New York** – Christie's Education New York has designed a new two-day course this winter that offers a taste of the new Global Contemporary Art Master's Degree program. The short course, "Finding the Global in Global Contemporary Art," also stands alone as a comprehensive introduction to the fast-changing world of contemporary art for collectors and art enthusiasts. The course packs lectures, panel discussions and gallery visits into a two-day package, December 9 – 10 from 9:30 am – 5:30 pm each day, and is led by program director Robin Reisenfeld and includes a lecture by author and art critic Eleanor Heartney.

Christie's Education also offers two other short courses this fall, on topics ranging from modern art to fine jewelry: "The Modern Metropolis: American Artists and New York," and "Special Topics in 20<sup>th</sup> Century Jewelry." The classes are appropriate for beginners as well as aficionados and are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Fees range from \$800 - \$1,800. Details follow.

#### DEC. 9 – 10: Finding the Global in Global Contemporary Art (NEW)

This course is for those who wish to understand the cutting-edge world of global contemporary art, by addressing what is 'global' about today's art and how it has become an integral part of a larger cross-cultural phenomenon. The two-day program will focus on the essential components of global contemporary art and provide a guide to viewing, collecting and interpreting it. Through a series of lectures, panel discussions and visits to prominent gallery dealers, students will

learn to recognize global contemporary art, how to navigate the challenges in collecting and preserving it, and the best methods and strategies for viewing it.

#### NOV. 13 – 14: Modern Metropolis: American Artists and New York

The first few decades of the 20th century brought dramatic changes to the physical and social landscape of New York. Many American artists asserted their modernity with paintings and photographs that chronicled this dynamic urban environment. This intensive two-day master class course examines New York cityscapes and street scenes by artists associated with the Ashcan School, the Stieglitz Circle, and Precisionism. Morning lectures will address this important period of American art history. Afternoon site visits throughout the city will examine significant works of art and tour some of the New York landmarks that inspired them.

#### DEC. 4 – 5: Special Topics in 20th Century Jewelry

Designed for professionals, collectors and the public, this course explores fascinating moments in the history of jewelry in the 20th century through lectures on individual designers and major houses, and behind-the-scene field studies including a workshop tour. Lectures will include Benjamin Macklowe speaking on Art Nouveau jewelry and Deanna Farneti Cera, who will speak on American Fashion jewelers from 1920-1960. Field studies will include a behind-thescenes visit to the workshop of Oscar Heyman and a tour with the archivist at Tiffany's to look at collection highlights from Tiffany's history. The course culminates in a walkthrough of the Magnificent Jewels sale with a Christie's specialist. Enrollment is limited.
