FINE CHINESE PAINTINGS AND CALLIGRAPHY



On 8 July 2020, Christie's held two live auctions of Chinese Paintings in Hong Kong: Fine Chinese Classical Paintings and Calligraphy, and Fine Chinese Modern and Contemporary Ink Paintings. The strong results achieved at both auctions reaffirm Christie's leadership in offering renowned private collections, and presenting fresh and coveted works to the market.

The market for Chinese paintings remained strong despite challenging circumstances in the past few months which limited international travel. Many overseas bidders and buyers who were unable to visit the auction in person, enthusiastically participated through absentee, phone, or online bidding.

With tightly curated sales and attractive estimates, the sales achieved high sell-through rates. Various artworks in great quality and physical condition, and with distinguished provenance were sold well above high estimates as a result of enthusiastic bidding. Fine Chinese Classical Paintings and Calligraphy sale totaled HK\$73,187,500

## FINE CHINESE CLASSICAL PAINTINGS AND CALLIGRAPHY: SALE TOTAL SURPASSED PRE-AUCTION HIGH ESTIMATE

The Fine Chinese Classical Paintings and Calligraphy auction achieved a sale total that surpassed its pre-auction high estimate.

*Endless Streams and Mountains* by Wang Hui from the King Kwei Collection of renowned collector Mr Chen Rentao, sold for **HK\$28,925,000 (US\$3,749,147)**, fetching five times its high estimate and demonstrating the precious value of this private collection again.

Study of Poems by Huang Daozhou was sold for **HK\$6,125,000 (US\$793,899)**, over six times its high estimate.



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## FINE CHINESE MODERN AND CONTEMPORARY INK PAINTINGS: OUTSTANDING SELL-THROUGH RATE

As Christie's first ever auction to combine Fine Chinese Modern Paintings and Chinese Contemporary Ink, we leveraged a cross-marketing strategy to promote this sale, offering a more diversified selection of artworks to collectors and buyers of both categories.

Album of Paintings and Calligraphy by Pu Ru achieved over four times its high estimate, selling for **HK\$21,275,000 (US\$2,815,911)**, setting an auction record for the artist at an international auction house

*Lady Playing Qin* by Lin Fengmian, with its important literature and exhibition record, sold for **HK\$3,245,000 (US\$4,295,009)**, 4.6 times its high estimate.

The first joint online auction curated by the Chinese Paintings and Chinese Works of Art departments was held from 1 to 15 July. The paintings section of this sale was led by Important Chinese paintings from the Wang Hsin-heng Family, as well as paintings by Zhang Daqian, Lin Fengmian, Li Keran, and Feng Zikai. The paintings section saw the following results:
