

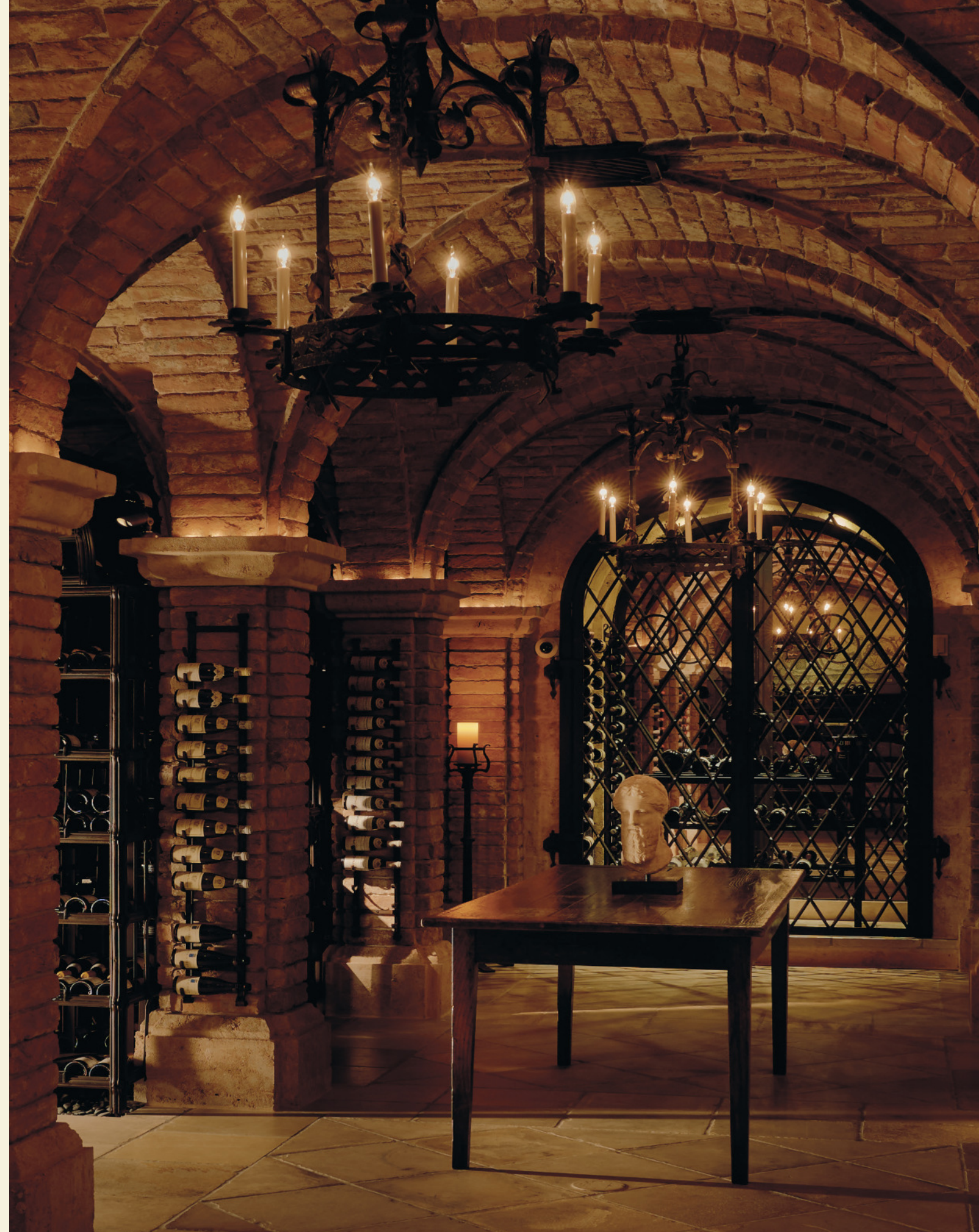

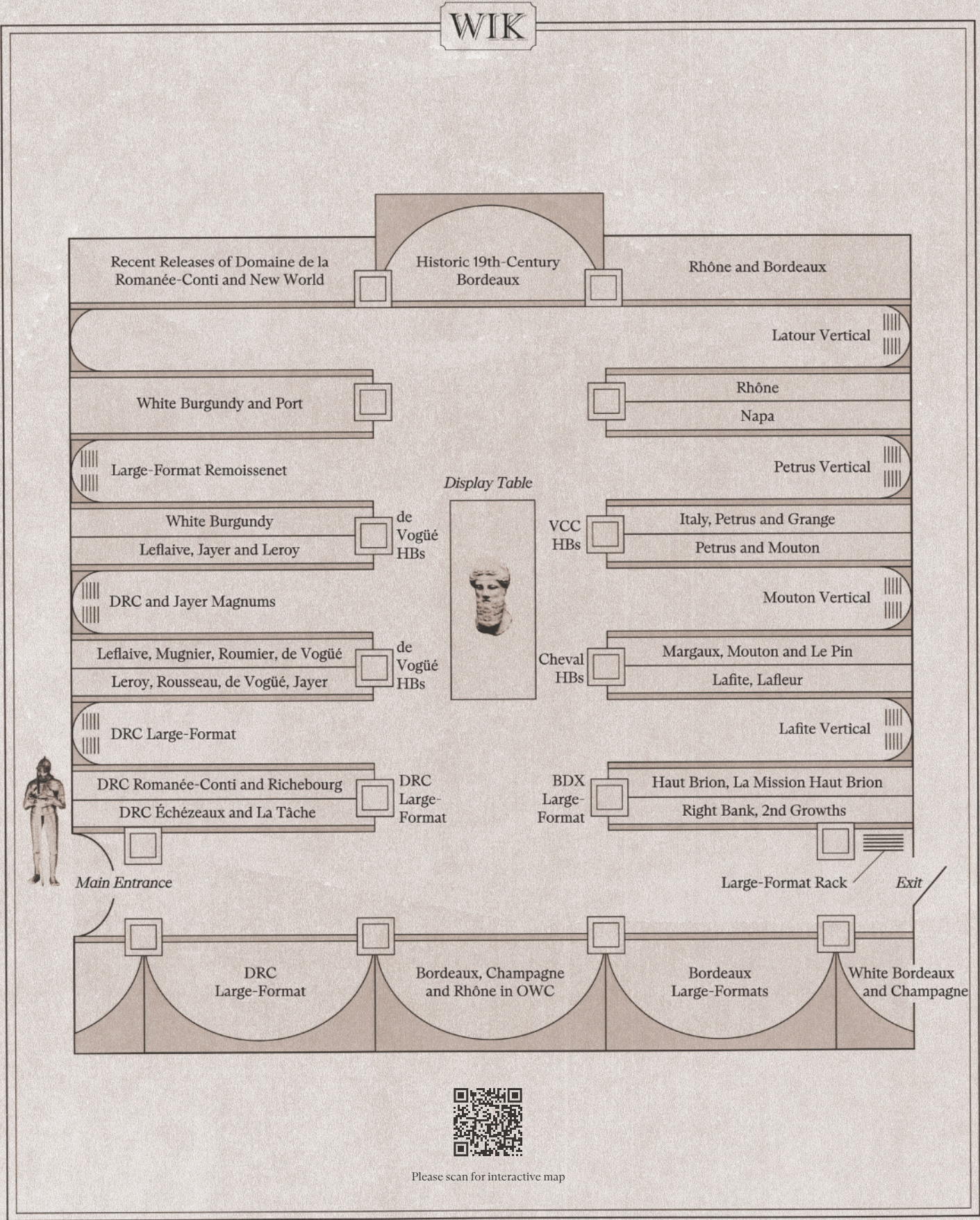

CHÂTEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD

BORDEAUX RED

CHÂTEAU LAFITE ROTHSCHILD

Château Lafite Rothschild boasts a rich and storied history, with the first recorded mention dating to 1234. The name ‘Lafite’ derives from the old Gascon word ‘fite,’ meaning ‘mound’ or ‘hillock,’ a reference to the elevated plateau on which the vineyard sits at one of the highest points in the appellation. Among Bordeaux’s five First Growths, Lafite is perhaps the most revered for its elegance, consistency, and remarkable longevity, traits that have earned it a reputation for excellence as well as consistently high prices. The estate enjoys an exceptional terroir near the Gironde estuary, in the northern part of Pauillac, close to the border with Saint-Estèphe. Pauillac itself is home to two of the other First Growths as well: Château Latour and Château Mouton Rothschild. In terms of red Bordeaux, the wines of Pauillac are classic versions characterised with intense blackcurrant flavours and aromas that develop into pencil lead, cedar and cigar box with age. The wines have a vibrant acidity and a firm tannic structure which enables the wines to age gracefully over many decades in the successful vintages. Amongst these Pauillac wines, Lafite has always held a particular allure. It is undoubtedly one of the world’s greatest wines. For power there are other châteaux, but for elegance and finesse, there is Lafite.

Located in the commune of Pauillac — home to three of Bordeaux’s five First Growths — Château Latour is renowned for the remarkable longevity and unwavering quality of the wines that have been produced here for centuries. Although Latour makes legendary wines in the best vintages, it is this estate’s consistent ability to turn out exceptional wines in vintages that are deemed to have been off-years that marks it out from its peers. This is thanks to the vineyard’s extraordinary terroir and climate, with the proximity of the vines to the nearby estuary meaning that they benefit from its temperature-moderating effects, which in extremely cold (1991) and extremely hot (2003) years has proved to be a lifeline for the vines. Some of the finest vintages of the 20th and 21st centuries produced at Latour include 1949, 1961, 1982, 1995, 2009 and 2010.

Great vintages from the 19th and early 20th centuries, when properly cellared, can still provide magnificent drinking experiences today, while modern classics from the late 20th century onward promise to evolve gracefully for many decades to come. From the 20th century, 1921, 1928, 1929, 1937, 1945, 1947, 1955, 1959, 1967, 1971, 1975, 1983, 1988, 1989 and 1990 are standouts.

LEROY

Lalou-Bize Leroy is a force of nature. She assumed leadership of Maison Leroy in 1955, upholding the exacting standards set by her father, Henri Leroy, who had built a reputation for sourcing the finest wines from across the Côte d’Or to bottle under the family label. The Leroy’s have also long been closely linked to one of Burgundy’s most iconic names, Domaine de la Romanée-Conti, as part-owners. The extraordinary quality of winemaking at both estates has made their wines among the most sought-after and collectible in the world.

In the late 1980s, Leroy bought the estates of Charles Noëllat in Vosne and Philippe Remy in Gevrey and began crafting superlative Domaine wines from plots such as Richebourg and Romanée St Vivant. She maintains that 90 per cent of the work of the estate is in the vineyard and she is an innovator, allowing the vines to flourish without cutting and overseeing a savage selection process.

Production is tiny — in great years such as 2010 only two barrels of Chambertin were produced. Sublime vintages of Domaine and Maison Leroy’s Grand Crus are lushly textured and rich with great ageing potential.

GUIGAL

Established in 1946, the true history of the Guigal Estate begins with the arrival of Etienne Guigal in the Rhône valley in 1924. Wine drinkers should rejoice that Etienne was struck by the majesty of Côte-Rôtie and chose to stay in the Rhône working in the vineyards of Vidal Fleury rather than returning home.

E. Guigal rapidly established itself as a leading négociant, and under the leadership of Marcel Guigal, the estate focused on acquiring some of the finest vineyards in Côte-Rôtie while also expanding into the southern Rhône. At first glance, the portfolio - comprising more than 20 wines - can seem daunting, raising questions about how such consistency and excellence are sustained across such a broad range. The answer of course lies in the exceptional quality of the vineyard holdings and the meticulous dedication of the estate’s vignerons and winemakers.

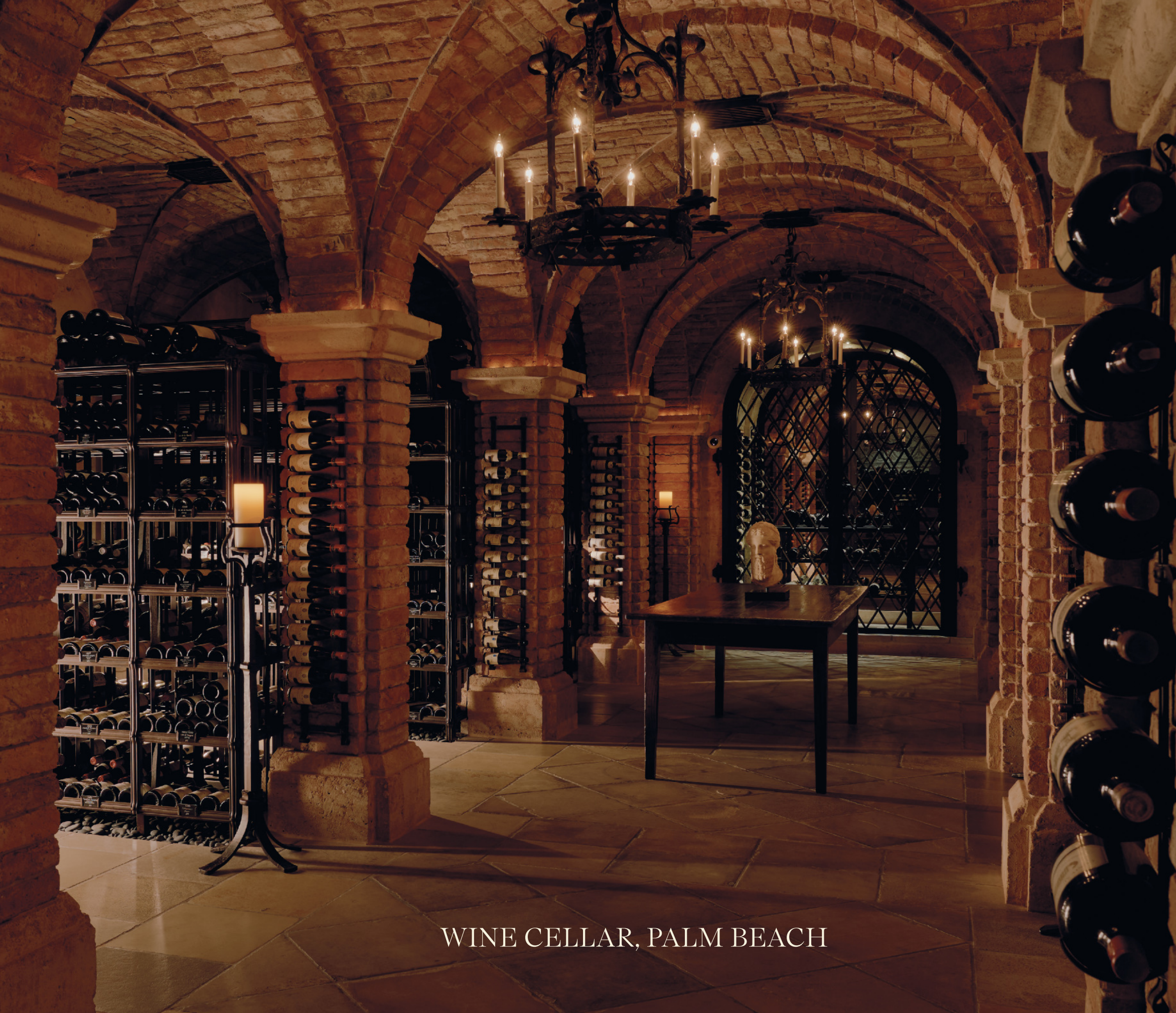

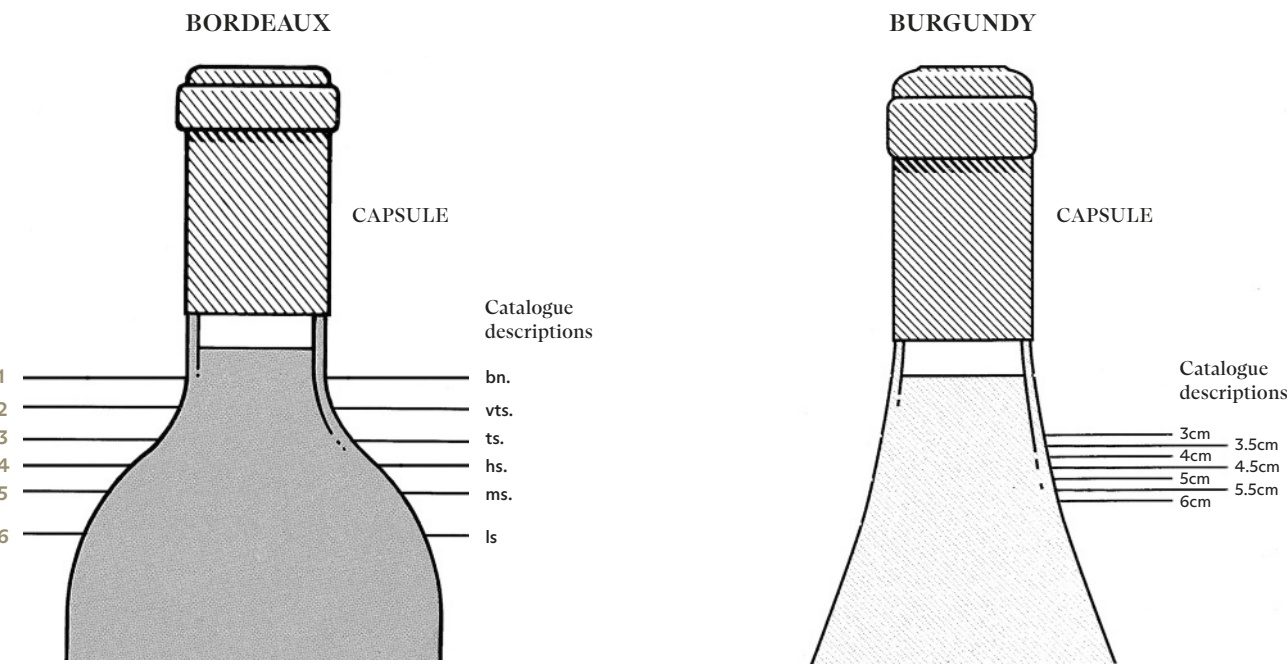

- 1 **u.** - ullage/ullages (levels)

2 **bn.** - bottom neck; completely acceptable for any age of wine or spirit

3 **vts.** - very top shoulder; completely acceptable for any age of wine or spirit

4 **ts.** - top shoulder; usual level for wines or spirits over 15 years old

5 **hs.** - high shoulder; typical reduction through the cork, usually no problem

6 **ms.** - mid shoulder; usually some deterioration of the cork and therefore some variation

Example: (u. 3ts) means 3 bottles ullaged to top shoulder.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured in .5 centimeter increments..

Burgundy Example: (u.2×3.5cm) means 2 bottles ullaged 3.5cm.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.

SPECIAL NOTICE

Though every effort is made to describe or measure the levels of older vintages, corks over 20 years old begin to lose their elasticity and levels can change between cataloguing and sale. Old corks have also been known to fail during or after shipment.

We therefore repeat that there is always a risk of cork failure with old wines and due allowance must be made for this.

1 CHRISTIE'S AS AGENT

Except as otherwise stated Christie's acts as agent for the seller. The contract for the sale of the property is therefore made between the seller and the buyer.

2 BEFORE THE SALE

(a) Examination of property

Prospective buyers are strongly advised to examine personally any property in which they are interested, before the auction takes place. Condition reports are usually available on request. Neither Christie's nor the seller provides any guarantee in relation to the nature of the property. The property is sold "as is."

(b) Catalogue and other descriptions

(c) Collection of purchases

We shall not be obliged to rescind a sale nor to refund any interest or other expenses incurred by the buyer where payment is made by the buyer in circumstances where an export license is required.

(f) Remedies for non payment

If the buyer fails to make payment in full in good cleared funds within the time required by paragraph 4(b) above, we shall be entitled in our absolute discretion to exercise one or more of the following rights or remedies (in addition to asserting any other rights or remedies available to us by law):

- (i) to charge interest at such rate as we shall reasonably decide;
- (ii) to hold the defaulting buyer liable for the total amount due and to commence legal proceedings for its recovery together with interest, legal fees and costs to the fullest extent permitted under applicable law;
- (iii) to cancel the sale;
- (iv) to resell the property publicly or privately on such terms as we shall think fit;
- (v) to pay the seller an amount up to the net proceeds payable in respect of the amount bid by the defaulting buyer;

Except as stated below, neither the seller, Christie's, nor any of their officers, employees or agents, give any representation, warranty or guarantee or assume any liability of any kind in respect of any lot

with regard to merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose, description, size, quality, condition, attribution, authenticity, rarity, importance, medium, provenance, exhibition history, literature or historical relevance. Except as required by local law any warranty of any kind whatsoever is excluded by this paragraph.

Notwithstanding any other terms of these Conditions of Sale, if within 30 days after the sale, Christie's has received from the original buyer of any property notice of a claim in writing that any lot is short or has suffered breakage, then Christie's in their sole discretion will decide any such claim as between the consignor and the buyer and may rescind the sale and refund the purchase price received.

The benefits of the warranty are not assignable and shall apply only to the original buyer of the lot as shown on the invoice originally issued by Christie's when the lot was sold at auction.

The original buyer must have remained the owner of the lot without disposing of any interest in it to any third party.

The buyer's sole and exclusive remedy against Christie's, and the seller, in place of any other remedy which might be available, is the cancellation of the sale and the refund of the original purchase price paid for the lot. Neither Christie's nor the seller will be liable for any special, incidental or consequential damages including, without limitation, loss of profits nor for interest.

2 YOUR WARRANTIES

- (a) You warrant that the funds used for settlement are not connected with any criminal activity, including tax evasion, and you are neither under investigation, nor have you been charged with or convicted of money laundering, terrorist activities or other crimes.
- (b) where you are bidding on behalf of another person, you warrant that:
 - (i) you have conducted appropriate customer due diligence on the ultimate buyer(s) of the lot(s) in accordance with all applicable anti-money laundering and sanctions laws, consent to us relying on this due diligence, and you will retain for a period of not less than 5 years the documentation evidencing the due diligence. You will make such documentation promptly available for immediate inspection by an independent third-party auditor upon our written request to do so;
 - (ii) the arrangements between you and the ultimate buyer(s) in relation to the lot or otherwise do not, in whole or in part, facilitate tax crimes;

7 COPYRIGHT

including the contents of this catalogue, is and shall remain at all times the property of Christie's and shall not be used by the buyer, nor by anyone else, without our prior written consent. Christie's and the seller make no representation or warranty that the buyer of a property will acquire any copyright or other reproduction rights in it.

8 SEVERABILITY

If any part of these Conditions of Sale is found by any court to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, that part shall be discounted and the rest of the conditions shall continue to be valid to the fullest extent permitted by law.

9 LAW AND JURISDICTION

The rights and obligations of the parties with respect to these Conditions of Sale, the conduct of the auction and any matters connected with any of the foregoing shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of the jurisdiction in which the auction is held. By bidding at auction, whether present in person or by agent, by written bid, telephone or other means, the buyer shall be deemed to have submitted, for the benefit of Christie's, to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of that country, state, county or province, and (if applicable) of the federal courts sitting in such state.

SPECIAL NOTICE

Corks over 20 years old begin to lose their elasticity and levels can change between cataloging and sale. Old corks have also been known to fail during or after shipment.

We therefore repeat that there is always a risk of cork failure with old wines and due allowance must be made for this.

Under no circumstances can a return be accepted or an adjustment of price or credit be made after delivery except under the terms stated in paragraph 5, above, of the Conditions of Sale.

Unless otherwise stated, Bordeaux are château bottled and all wines are bottled in the country of production.

Important note regarding opening of cases and listing of levels: Christie's general policy is to open all wood cases and to describe levels. Bidders must make allowances for reasonable variations in ullage which may be encountered in cases older than twenty years.

ULLAGE

The amount by which the level of wine is short of being full: these levels may vary according to age of the wines and, as far as can be ascertained by inspection prior to the sale, are described in the catalogue.

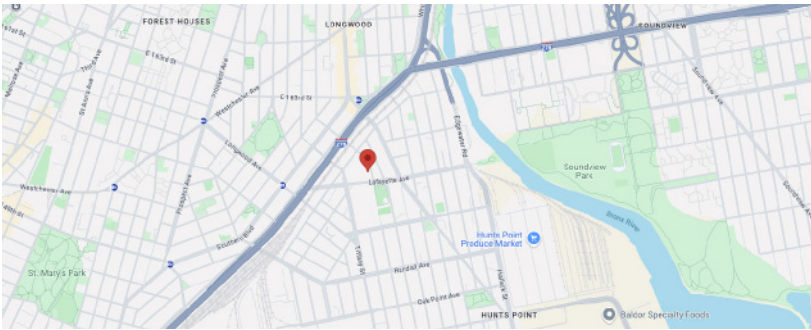
