



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

CHÂTEAU MARGAUX

The wines of the Château Margaux are celebrated for their elegance and multilayered complexity, with violet floral and acacia aromatics and intense, spiced cassis fruit flavours.

The majority of the vineyards are on deep gravel and gravely clay-limestone soils that are ideally suited to Cabernet Sauvignon. Merlot is planted on soils which have higher content of clay and limestone. he diversity of soils contributes to the complexity and depth of their wines.

There have been many moments of startling brilliance, such as the exceptional, legendary 1784 vintage that wooed Thomas Jefferson, along with stunning wines produced in 1893, 1900, 1929, 1945, 1949, 1953, 1955, 1959 and 1961.

Since the Mentzelopoulos family took over in 1977, the wines have been on particularly outstanding form; the top vintages from the 1980s, 1990s, 2000s and onwards are nothing short of spectacular. Superlative wines were produced in the following vintages, 1982, 1983, 1986, 1990, 1996, 2000, 2005, 2009, 2010, 2015, 2016, 2018 and 2019.

Of the vintages that appear regularly at Christie’s auctions, the most highly sought-after are the monumental 1900, 1945, 1947, 1953, 1982, 1990, 1996, 2005, 2009 and 2010 vintages.

CHÂTEAU MOUTON ROTHSCHILD

In 1853, Baron Nathaniel de Rothschild bought Château Brane-Mouton and renamed it Mouton-Rothschild. In 1945, to celebrate the ‘Année de la Victoire,’ Baron Philippe de Rothschild commissioned the artist Philippe Juillan to design the label, which began the tradition of a different artist designing the label for each vintage that continues to this day (except for 1953 and 1977). Such famous names as Picasso, Kandinsky, Francis Bacon, and Andy Warhol have featured and helped to strengthen the reputation of the Château. Artists have never been paid for their work, instead being rewarded with bottles of Mouton-Rothschild. Château Mouton-Rothschild was elevated to First Growth status in 1973. Mouton-Rothschild has 82 hectares of vineyards, of which 77 hectares are planted with red grapes: 77% Cabernet Sauvignon, 12% Merlot, 9% Cabernet Franc, and 2% Petit Verdot. For the Grand Vin, the average age of vines is 48 years, with a density of 8,500 per hectare planted on gravel soils.





It is difficult to imagine the world of fine wine without Petrus; the estate exerts a gravitational pull, radiating influence like a celestial body. In the finest vintages, few wines rival its stature in terms of critical acclaim or market value, and it is justly renowned for its formidable power, profound concentration, and multi-layered complexity. The vineyard is located in Pomerol on a plateau dominated by iron-rich (crasse de fer) clay soils that give the wines their structure and power. They are well drained due to a gentle slope. The clay content retains some water which reduces hydric stress and creates a cooler mesoclimate that is ideally suited to the early ripening Merlot. The average age of the vines is 45 years.

LE PIN

Le Pin is among the world’s most sought-after and collectible wines. With annual production limited to just 600 to 700 cases, its rarity, combined with the wine’s hallmark richness, concentration, and power, drives exceptional prices at auction. The estate takes its name from a solitary pine tree that stands beside the winery. 1979 was the first vintage.

The south-facing vineyard is located on the Pomerol plateau. The very well drained soil is composed of gravel, sand, and clay on an iron-rich base. Yields are kept low at around 30 hectolitres per hectare. The grapes are hand-harvested and are fermented in stainless steel before being matured in new oak barriques for between 14 and 18 months and bottled without filtration. Acclaimed vintages such as 1989, 2000, 2005, 2009, and 2010 have produced wines of remarkable depth and distinction, celebrated for their power, balance, and aging potential.

The jewel in the crown of the Côte d'Or, this peerless estate commands a roll call of the greatest Grand Cru vineyards: Romanée-Conti, La Tâche, Richebourg, Romanée-Saint-Vivant, Grands Echézeaux, Echézeaux, and Montrachet, among others.

That regal legacy resonates even today in the vineyard's enduring mystique and its place at the pinnacle of Burgundy.

DOMAINE DE LA ROMANÉE-CONTI, ROMANÉE-CONTI

Domaine de la Romanée-Conti is widely regarded as one of the greatest wine estates in the world, and it has long stood as Burgundy’s most renowned domaine - known universally by its initials, DRC. DRC bottles are among the world’s rarest, most renowned and most highly sought-after. It takes its name from the Domaine’s most famous vineyard, Romanée-Conti Grand Cru. The boundaries of this vineyard were established back in the 16th century, and over time, its name changed from Cros des Cloux, to La Romanée, to Romanée-Conti, after its purchase by King Louis XV’s cousin, the Prince de Conti. There is no disputing the quality of the wines, particularly their highly sought-after, longest-lived, greatly-prized Romanée-Conti Grand Cru. Romanée-Conti is very scarce, as on average only 450 cases are produced each vintage, with some vintages yielding only around 3000 bottles.

This famous estate owns 70 percent of the Grand Cru Musigny and nearly a fifth of Bonnes Mares. The domaine is based in a 15th-century house in Chambolle believed to have been built or first inhabited by Jean Moisson - an ancestor of the current owners - marking the beginning of a family lineage that continues to this day. Few estates in Burgundy have held their vineyard lands so long.

Alongside Grand Cru Musigny, the domaine’s other star is their 2.7 hectare plot of Bonnes Mares, which accounts for 400 cases a year. Fine old vintages deliver violet, strawberry notes with a delicate peony blossom underpinned by a ground coffee bean flavour and toasty oak. Darker and more brooding than the Musigny, former head of the estate François Millet described it is an electric wine - like a thunderstorm about to break.

The ‘first lady’ of the de Vogüé portfolio is the Premier Cru Les Amoureuses (‘the lovers’). This jewel-like parcel, just 0.56 hectares in size, is ploughed by horse on account of its coarse, stony topsoil. Production is exceedingly limited, with only around 160 cases released from the domaine each vintage. The Domaine views Les Amoureuses as no less than Musigny’s little sister, refined but never flippant, and a recent tasting of the stellar 1999 vintage reveals a bouquet of redcurrant and loganberry against a back-drop of sous-bois and mushroom. In time complexity develops, yet it never reaches the leather-armchair study wreathed in cigar-smoke where Les Amoureuses older brother Musigny sits.

HEITZ CELLAR

Heitz Cellar is a venerable and distinguished name in the Napa Valley wine scene, celebrated for its pioneering contributions to the region’s wine heritage. Founded in 1961 by Joe Heitz and his wife Alice, the winery established itself with an initial purchase of a small 8.5-acre vineyard south of St. Helena, which was planted with Grignolino grapes. The winery is renowned for its innovative practices, such as being the first in the U.S. to champion the single vineyard designation with its Martha’s Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon in 1966, signalling a significant breakthrough in recognizing the unique qualities of specific vineyard sites. Martha’s Vineyard has produced some of the greatest Californian wines ever made, including the legendary 1974, which features here. Heitz’s commitment to quality was also evident in its handling of challenges such as phylloxera, demonstrating resilience and dedication to winemaking excellence. The winery’s legacy continued with David Heitz, Joe’s son, taking over winemaking duties in the late 1970s. Under his guidance, Heitz expanded its vineyard holdings and maintained its reputation for producing exceptional wines. Heitz Cellar has played a monumental role in the development of Napa Valley’s wine industry and continues to be celebrated for its influence, tradition, and the exceptional quality of its wines, including its iconic Martha’s Vineyard Cabernet Sauvignon.

SCREAMING EAGLE

The vineyard, located on the east side of Oakville, slopes from the Silverado Trail toward the Napa Valley with 59 acres of vines. The soil is virtually a rock pile on a gentle, west-facing slope east of the Napa River. The property is conveniently nestled in an area in the valley where the grapes receive enough heat during the day for optimum ripening, followed by light, gentle afternoon breezes that blow north from San Pablo Bay. Limited in quantity, only a small portion of the grapes are used to make Screaming Eagle Cabernet Sauvignon; the rest of the grapes are sold to other wineries. The signature of the wine is captured in the rich, loamy earthiness that gives the Cabernet a plush structural foundation and folds in with its layers of currant, plum, cherry and herbal flavors. It is not only consistent in its complex and concentrated flavor but also in its blend: 85 percent to 88 percent Cabernet, 10 percent to 12 percent Merlot and 1 percent to 2 percent Cabernet Franc. This wine of humble beginnings, which was first created by then owner, Jean Phillips, at home is now one of the most celebrated wines in Napa Valley. Starting in 2006, Screaming Eagle began producing a second wine called Second Flight.

AUSTRALIA

PENFOLDS

Penfolds is nothing short of an icon of Australian winemaking excellence. The estate was founded by Dr. Christopher Penfold and his wife Mary in 1844, initially planting vines at the now-iconic Magill Estate. This early venture into viticulture, focusing first on fortified wines, laid the groundwork for what would become a cornerstone of the Australian wine industry. Under Mary Penfold's stewardship after her husband's passing in 1870, the winery expanded its repertoire to include Clarets and Rieslings, setting a precedent for innovation and quality. The mid-20th century marked a pivotal era for Penfolds, with Max Schubert's appointment as Chief Winemaker in 1948 and the introduction of Grange in 1951. This period saw a shift towards table wines, aligning with evolving consumer preferences. Gladys Penfold Hyland, leading the company into the public domain in 1962, played a crucial role in supporting Schubert's visionary work, establishing Grange as a flagship offering and a symbol of Penfolds' winemaking prowess. This was an era of exceptional innovation and research and many fascinating experimental wines were developed at this time, some of which feature in this sale. Recognition for Penfolds' contributions to the wine world has come from many corners with accolades including "New World Winery of the Year" by *Wine Enthusiast Magazine* and being named the Most Admired Wine Brand by Drinks International.

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

2 **bn.** - bottom neck; completely acceptable for any age of wine or spirit

3 **vts.** - very top shoulder; completely acceptable for any age of wine or spirit

4 **ts.** - top shoulder; usual level for wines or spirits over 15 years old

5 **hs.** - high shoulder; typical reduction through the cork, usually no problem

6 **ms.** - mid shoulder; usually some deterioration of the cork and therefore some variation

Example: (u. 3ts) means 3 bottles ullaged to top shoulder.

Because of the slope of shoulder it is impractical to describe levels as mid-shoulder, etc. Wherever appropriate the level between cork and wine will be measured in .5 centimeter increments..

Burgundy Example: (u.2×3.5cm) means 2 bottles ullaged 3.5cm.

The condition and drinkability of burgundy is less affected by ullage than its equivalent from Bordeaux. For example, a 5 to 7 cm. ullage in a 30-year-old burgundy can be considered normal, indeed good for age, 3.5 to 4 cm. excellent for age, even 7cm. rarely a risk.

SPECIAL NOTICE

Though every effort is made to describe or measure the levels of older vintages, corks over 20 years old begin to lose their elasticity and levels can change between cataloguing and sale. Old corks have also been known to fail during or after shipment.

We therefore repeat that there is always a risk of cork failure with old wines and due allowance must be made for this.

Under no circumstances can an adjustment of price or credit be made after delivery except under the terms stated in Paragraph E2 of the Conditions of Sale.

Unless otherwise stated, Bordeaux are château bottled and all wines are bottled in the country of production.

Christie's offers all absentee and telephone bidding services as a convenience to our clients, but will not be responsible for errors or failures to execute bids.

(f) Currency converter

At some auctions a currency converter may be operated. Errors may occur in the operation of the currency converter and we do not accept liability to bidders who follow the currency converter rather than the actual bidding in the saleroom.

(g) Video or digital images

At some auctions there may be a video or digital screen. Errors may occur in its operation and in the quality of the image and we do not accept liability for such errors.

(h) Reserves

Unless otherwise indicated, all lots are offered subject to a reserve, which is the confidential minimum price below which the lot will not be sold. The reserve will not exceed the low estimate printed in the catalogue. If any lots are not subject to a reserve, they will be identified with the symbol • next to the lot number. The auctioneer may open the bidding on any lot below the reserve by placing a bid on behalf of the seller. The auctioneer may continue to bid on behalf of the seller up to the amount of the reserve, either by placing consecutive bids or by placing bids in response to other bidders. Absentee bids submitted on "no reserve" lots will, in the absence of a higher bid, be executed at approximately 50% of the low pre sale estimate or at the amount of the bid if it is less than 50% of the low pre-sale estimate.

(i) Auctioneer's discretion

The auctioneer has the right at his absolute and sole discretion to refuse any bid, to advance the bidding in such a manner as he may decide, to withdraw or divide any lot, to combine any two or more lots and, in the case of error or dispute, and whether during or after the sale, to determine the successful bidder, to continue the bidding, to cancel the sale or to reoffer

and resell the item in dispute. If any dispute arises after the sale, our sale record is conclusive.

(j) Successful bid and passing of risk

Subject to the auctioneer's discretion, the highest bidder accepted by the auctioneer will be the buyer and the striking of his hammer marks the acceptance of the highest bid and the conclusion of a contract for sale between the seller and the buyer. Risk and responsibility for the lot (including frames or glass where relevant) passes to the buyer at the expiration of seven calendar days from the date of the sale or on collection by the buyer if earlier.

4 AFTER THE SALE

(a) Buyer's premium

In addition to the hammer price, the buyer agrees to pay to us the buyer's premium together with any applicable value added tax, sales or compensating use tax or equivalent tax in the place of sale. The buyer's premium for wine is 25% of the hammer price on each lot.

(b) Payment and passing of title

Immediately following the sale, the buyer must provide us with his or her name and permanent address and, if so requested, details of the bank from which payment will be made. The buyer must pay the full amount due (comprising the hammer price, buyer's premium and any applicable taxes) not later than 4:30 p.m. on the seventh calendar day following the sale. This applies even if the buyer wishes to export the lot and an export license is, or may be, required. The buyer will not acquire title to the lot until all amounts due to us from the buyer have been received by us in good cleared funds even in circumstances where we have released the lot to the buyer.

(c) Collection of purchases

We shall be entitled to retain items sold until all amounts due to us, or to Christie's International plc, or to any of its affiliates, subsidiaries or parent companies worldwide, have been received in full in good cleared funds or until the buyer has satisfied such other terms as we, in our sole discretion, shall require. Subject to this, the buyer shall collect purchased lots within seven calendar days from the date of the sale unless otherwise agreed between us and the buyer.

(d) Packing, handling and shipping

Although we shall use reasonable efforts to take care when handling, packing and shipping a purchased lot, we are not responsible for the acts or omissions of third parties whom we might retain for these purposes. Similarly, where we may suggest other handlers, packers or carriers if so requested, we do not accept responsibility or liability for their acts or omissions. Please see Shipping and Collection of Wine under Important Notices at the back of the catalogue for more information.

(e) Export license

Unless otherwise agreed by us in writing, the fact that the buyer wishes to apply for an export license does not affect his or her obligation to make payment within seven days nor our right to charge interest or storage charges on late payment. We shall not be obliged to rescind a sale nor to refund any interest or other expenses incurred by the buyer where payment is made by the buyer in circumstances where an export license is required.

(f) Remedies for non payment

If the buyer fails to make payment in full in good cleared funds within the time required by paragraph 4(b) above, we shall be entitled in our absolute discretion to exercise one or more of the following rights or remedies (in addition to asserting any other rights or remedies available to us by law):

- (i) to charge interest at such rate as we shall reasonably decide;
- (ii) to hold the defaulting buyer liable for the total amount due and to commence legal proceedings for its recovery together with interest, legal fees and costs to the fullest extent permitted under applicable law;
- (iii) to cancel the sale;
- (iv) to resell the property publicly or privately on such terms as we shall think fit;
- (v) to pay the seller an amount up to the net proceeds payable in respect of the amount bid by the defaulting buyer;
- (vi) to set off against any amounts which we, or Christie's International plc, or any of its affiliates, subsidiaries or parent companies worldwide, may owe the buyer in any other transactions, the outstanding amount remaining unpaid by the buyer;
- (vii) where several amounts are owed by the buyer to us, or to Christie's International plc, or to any of its affiliates, subsidiaries or parent companies worldwide, in respect of different transactions, to apply any amount paid to discharge any amount owed in respect of any particular transaction, whether or not the buyer so directs;
- (viii) to reject at any future auction any bids made by or on behalf of the buyer or to obtain a deposit from the buyer before accepting any bids;
- (ix) to exercise all the rights and remedies of a person holding security over any property in our possession owned by the buyer, whether by way of pledge, security interest or in any other way, to the fullest extent permitted by the law of the place where such property is located. The buyer will be deemed to have granted such security to us and we may retain such property as collateral security for such buyer's obligations to us;
- (x) to take such other action as we deem necessary or appropriate.

If we resell the property under paragraph (iv) above, the defaulting buyer shall be liable for payment of any deficiency between the total amount originally due to us and the price obtained upon resale as well as for all costs, expenses, damages, legal fees and commissions and premiums of whatever kind associated with both sales or otherwise arising from the default. If we pay any amount to the seller under paragraph (v) above, the buyer acknowledges that Christie's shall have all of the rights of the seller, however arising, to pursue the buyer for such amount.

(g) Failure to collect purchases

Where purchases are not collected within seven calendar days from the date of the sale, whether or not payment has been made, we shall be permitted to remove the property to a third party warehouse at the buyer's expense, and only release the items after payment in full has been made of removal, storage, handling, insurance and any other costs incurred, together with payment of all other amounts due to us.

5 WARRANTIES

1 EXTENT OF CHRISTIE'S LIABILITY

Neither the seller, Christie's, nor any of their officers, employees or agents, are responsible for the correctness of any statement of whatever kind concerning any lot, whether written or oral, nor for any other errors or omissions in description or for any faults or defects in any lot. Except as stated below, neither the seller, Christie's, nor any of their officers, employees or agents, give any representation, warranty or guarantee or assume any liability of any kind in respect of any lot

with regard to merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose, description, size, quality, condition, attribution, authenticity, rarity, importance, medium, provenance, exhibition history, literature or historical relevance. Except as required by local law any warranty of any kind whatsoever is excluded by this paragraph.

Notwithstanding any other terms of these Conditions of Sale, if within 30 days after the sale, Christie's has received from the original buyer of any property notice of a claim in writing that any lot is short or has suffered breakage, then Christie's in their sole discretion will decide any such claim as between the consignor and the buyer and may rescind the sale and refund the purchase price received.

The benefits of the warranty are not assignable and shall apply only to the original buyer of the lot as shown on the invoice originally issued by Christie's when the lot was sold at auction.

The original buyer must have remained the owner of the lot without disposing of any interest in it to any third party.

 - (iii) you do not know, and have no reason to suspect, that the funds used for settlement are connected with, the proceeds of any criminal activity, including tax evasion, or that the ultimate buyer(s) are under investigation, or have been charged with or convicted of money laundering, terrorist activities or other crimes.

6 OUR ABILITY TO CANCEL

In addition to the other rights of cancellation contained in this agreement, we can cancel a sale of a lot if : (i) any of your warranties in paragraph 5.2 are not correct; (ii) we reasonably believe that completing the transaction is, or may be, unlawful; or (iii) we reasonably believe that the sale places us or the seller under any liability to anyone else or may damage our reputation.

7 COPYRIGHT

The copyright in all images, illustrations and written material produced by or for Christie's, relating to a lot

including the contents of this catalogue, is and shall remain at all times the property of Christie's and shall not be used by the buyer, nor by anyone else, without our prior written consent. Christie's and the seller make no representation or warranty that the buyer of a property will acquire any copyright or other reproduction rights in it.

8 SEVERABILITY

If any part of these Conditions of Sale is found by any court to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, that part shall be discounted and the rest of the conditions shall continue to be valid to the fullest extent permitted by law.

9 LAW AND JURISDICTION

The rights and obligations of the parties with respect to these Conditions of Sale, the conduct of the auction and any matters connected with any of the foregoing shall be governed and interpreted by the laws of the jurisdiction in which the auction is held. By bidding at auction, whether present in person or by agent, by written bid, telephone or other means, the buyer shall be deemed to have submitted, for the benefit of Christie's, to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of that country, state, county or province, and (if applicable) of the federal courts sitting in such state.


