



Christie's is the only major auction house to feature a dynamic approach to the selling of Latin American art.

With its long history of expertise and innovation, Christie's hosts dedicated online and live sales in our New York saleroom each season, while also successfully selling the category within global sales of modern and contemporary art.

The 2022 spring season marked unprecedented enthusiasm for the category of Latin American Art, setting new records and attracting clients from over 23 countries across Europe, Asia and the Americas. With exceptional prices achieved for works by Diego Rivera, Tomás Sánchez, Antonio Bandeira, Eugenio Landesio, Beatriz González and Sarah Grilo, the 2022 spring season realised eight new world auction records, culminating in the sale of Fernando Botero's Man on a Horse which achieved \$4,320,000, far surpassing the previous record for the artist. Additional highlights included **Tomás** Sánchez's Llegada del caminante a la laguna that sold for \$1,800,000 - setting a new record for the artist – as well as **Diego Rivera's La Bordadora that quadrupled its** high estimate to sell for \$4,140,000 to the Museum of Fine Arts Houston.




MARCH 2022 DEDICATED LATIN AMERICAN ART SALE

Our March 2022 Latin American Art sale soared above pre-sale expectations, achieving \$27.5 million and setting **eight new world auction records** for artists, including Fernando Botero with *Man on a Horse*, which realized \$4.3 million, and Tomás Sanchez with *Llegada del caminante a la laguna* which sold for \$1.8 million.












