BUGATTI, FERRARI AND DUNHILL BENTLEY LEAD CHRISTIE'S APRIL SALE

Exceptional Motor Cars and Automobilia Tuesday, 19 April 2005

London – Christie's International Motor Cars is pleased to announce the first London sale of 2005, which will take place on 19 April. This sale will include 22 cars from various ages of motoring, and will have examples from Ferrari, Bentley, Bugatti, Rolls-Royce and Jaguar, among others.

Highlighting the sale are examples from four different eras of motoring:

1897 Panhard-Levassor 6hp Twin Cylinder Phaeton



The Panhard-Levassor was the first ever luxury car, and the company dominated the luxury market until the arrival of Mercedes in 1901. In 1895, a Panhard-Levassor won the first ever motor race by driving from Paris to Bordeaux and back again. Unfortunately, few examples have survived – the Veteran Car Club of Great Britain records just 35. As a result, it is a rare occurrence to see such an example of motoring history at auction. This example, which is known as 'William the Conqueror', was delivered to a

motor dealership in Paris in December 1897. It was discovered in the late 1970s in northern France, and was brought to the UK where it underwent a comprehensive restoration. The car carries an estimate of £100,000-150,000.

1923 Bentley 3 Litre Drophead Coupé by Park Ward



This immaculate vintage Bentley was delivered new to Alfred Dunhill in December 1923. Dunhill is most famous for founding the company which carries his name, and which aimed to supply 'everything but the motor' in its motor accessories range. This car comes with uniquely styled coachwork by Park Ward, and has an estimate of £60,000-80,000.

1964 Ferrari 250 GT Lusso

The 250 GT Lusso was the last of the 250 series cars, and is arguably one of the most beautiful Ferraris



ever made. This example is one of approximately 350 built, and was formerly the property of motor racing boss Rob Walker. A member of the Johnny Walker whisky family, Rob Walker was an amateur racing driver before founding his own Formula 1 team. The team competed between 1958 and 1968, and achieved 9 Grand Prix wins with triumphant drivers including Stirling Moss, Jo Siffert, Jochen Rindt and

Graham Hill. This example has an estimate of £170,000-200,000.

1992 Bugatti EB110



The Bugatti EB110 was unveiled on 15 September 1991, and represented the first appearance of the famous Bugatti marque since 1956. The car offered a combination of speed and luxury. It broke the world record for top speed for a homologated production road car when it was recorded at 212.5 mph, yet it came equipped with leather electric seats, air-conditioning and a CD player. A price of £340,000 ensured that the car remained

exclusive, and this is one of 108 models produced. The estimate on this example is £100,000-130,000.
