"Following the fantastic prices set in Hong Kong for the Hartman collection of jades, it was very gratifying to see the highly esoteric and scholarly set of ten jades from the Song dynasty leading today's sale of *Fine Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art.* Formerly in the collection of Stephen Junkunc III – as two other works featuring in the top-10, lots 222 and 385 – this set was bought by a private collector from China for \$1.8 million. The sculpture section of the sale performed equally strongly with the superb Tang dynasty stone head of Buddha and the limestone Buddhist plaque from the late Yuan/Early Ming dynasty attracting active bidding. The ceramics section featured several superb objects such as the celadon double-gourd vase, Ming dynasty (\$420,000) and the large Qianlong blue and white moon flask (\$384,000). *Important Snuff Bottles from the Jet Collection Part IV* totaled \$2,959,200 and highlight of the sale included an Imperial enameled glass snuff bottle, Qianlong period (\$\$273,600). The presence of Hong Kong, Taiwan and China based collectors was clearly noticeable throughout both sales."
