SUPERB LONDON COLLECTION TO BE OFFERED AT CHRISTIE'S IN MAY

Park West - The Sale of Works of Art from a Regent's Park Villa

Park West – The Property of a Private Collector 22 May 2003

London – In May 2003, Christie's London will stage two superb private single owner collections of furniture and works of art, the first to be overseen at King Street by the newly formed Private Collection and Country House Sale Department, 50 Years of Collecting – The Decorative Arts of Georgian England, on 14 May (see separate release) and Park West – The Property of a Private Collector on 22 May. The Park West sale will offer works amassed by a collector who, with immense flair, formed a remarkable group of objects to adorn the romantic interiors of his London home. A John Nash-Revival villa built in a picturesque crescent beside Regents Park, Park West has for 25 years been the setting for a varied yet focused collection of sculptural and decorative furniture and works of art. The Collection is expected to realize in the region of £1 million.

"The Park-West Collection perfectly encapsulates the essence of the late 18th century with gilt-bronzes and terracotta sculptures, French furniture, allegorical pictures and delicate Meissen porcelain, a highly tempting array for discerning connoisseurs, passionate collectors and style-conscious decorators alike", says Orlando Rock and Andrew Waters, from the Private Collection and Country House Sale Department "Many of the objects to be offered were acquired in the early 1980s from respected dealers, such as William Redford, Agnew's and Partridge Fine Arts, or carry the provenance of earlier great collection sales."

A highlight of the Park West Collection is a grouping of over 40 terracotta sculptures and an object that perhaps best typifies the taste of the collector is a playful, and yet graceful, terracotta figure of a bacchante raising a tambourine (estimate: £25,000-35,000). The figure once formed part of the collection of Major-General Sir George Burns and was included in the celebrated sale held by Christie's at North Mymms Park, Hertfordshire in 1979 (lot 4) and is attributed to Claude Michel (1738-1814) – better known as Clodion – one of the most influential sculptors of the late 18th century. This representation of Baccantes can be compared with an example by Clodion signed and dated 1783 in the Dutuit Collection, Petit Palais, Paris. Clodion specialized in terracotta groups of cavorting nymphs and satyrs, and his work can be found in many of the world's most important museums.

The Park West Collection also boasts a set of four Louis XIV white marble busts of the seasons, circa 1700 (originally purchased from the J.P. Morgan family home, Princetown, New Jersey) (estimate: $f_{20,000-30,000}$) and a Louis XVI terracotta bust of a Gentleman by Clemens Jayet, who was appointed Professor of Sculpture at the Academy of St Luke, Paris in 1804 (estimate: £10,000-15,000). From the drawing-room of Park West, furniture ranges from a Louis XVI ormolu-mounted console desserte by Charles Topino (estimate: £10,000-15,000) to a fine Napoleon III burr-yew secretaire à abattant attributed to Alexandre Beurdeley (estimate: £20,000-40,000), after a design by Adam Weisweiler, inset with a jasperware panel depicting 'The Judgement of Paris'. A pair of triumphant Empire ormolu and patinated figural candelabra (estimate: £20,000-30,000), a pair of Italian Marmo Rosso Antico urns by Bernadetto Boschetti, mid 19th century (estimate: £15,000-25,000) and a fine bronze figure of Perseus Arming by Sir Alfred Gilbert, O.M., R.A., (1854-1934) (estimate: £15,000-25,000) further indicate the diverse nature of the collection. The sale will also feature a select group of ceramics including a pair of Italian Castelli maiolica plaques, circa 1750, from the Workshop of the Grue family, (£6,000-8,000) and a pair of Meissen Malabar figures on Louis XV ormolu bases (f,6,000-8,000).

The Private Collection and Country House Sale Department will be concentrating on developing single-owner and special collection sales as well as house sales in the UK, and house sales in those Continental European countries without a dedicated saleroom.

Orlando has been responsible for the sales of both important French and Continental Furniture and Important English furniture in London and subsequently spent three years in New York. Andrew Waters joined the Christie's South Kensington furniture department in 1989. He has been responsible for cataloguing the furniture sections of the Country House sales for many years and notable successes have included Castello de Bendinat in Majorca, the Manor House at Clifton Hampden and, most recently, the ambitious Tyntesfield project.
