Comment: Rodney Woolley, Director, Head of Department, and Dominic Simpson, Director, Head of Sale: Continuing the success of the 31st March sale, today's inaugural sale entirely devoted to Italian Ceramics achieved strong prices throughout. Bidding was fierce for pieces from the Renaissance in particular, but strong prices were achieved throughout from lot 1, the early 15th century Tusacn jug which achieved over twice its estimate, to lot 126 at the end of the sale, the Cantagalli vase of circa 1890, which sold for ten times its estimate. The market for Pavia was more selective, but overall there was competitive bidding from both established private and trade buyers and buyers new to the field. The strength of the market for Italian maiolica appears to have grown in recent years, and it was interesting to see the top three lots go to private European collectors. We were particularly delighted to see the Montelupo istoriato dish depicting a biblical scene, lot 30, fetch £42,500.

We look forward to our next sale of truly magnificent English and Dutch Delft which forms part of the Simon Sainsbury Collection, which will be offered on 18th June.
