The rare full case of 1947 Cheval Blanc sold for £84,375 and is the highest price achieved at auction in Europe for a case of claret. Wines from Bordeaux claimed all top ten spots as buyers sought out the very best with three magnums of Petrus 2000 making £17,999, a huge price for such a young wine. We were particularly pleased with the results for the two superb private collections both exceeding their top end estimates," said **Chris Munro, Head of London Wine Department.**

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
