“We are very pleased with our inaugural Dog Sale, which achieved the highest ever total in this auction category. Several world auction records were achieved including for Thomas Blinks, which at \$564,000 doubled the previous record. Another spectacular price was Sargent's very rare portrait of *Pointy*, which made \$432,000, over five times the high estimate. There was very strong bidding amongst American private clients for works across the spectrum, from the academic portrait by Gérôme to the whimsical sculpture of Niki de Saint Phalle, which showed the enduring appeal of this subject-matter.
