"The Champalimaud sale concluded successfully today following on from the excitement of last night's auction. The final auction result makes the Champalimaud Collection the second highest total for a single-owner sale in Europe, only topped by the Rothschild sale that achieved £57.7 million in 1999, also staged by Christie's. A record price was made by the outstanding Kangxi leopards which sold for £2,360,000. Further highlights today included a pair of late Louis XVI ormolu-mounted ebony, pewter and brass Boulle marquetry meubles d'appui that sold for £859,200) and a set of four Louis XV silver table-candlesticks, maker's mark Louis Lenhendrick, Paris that achieved £153,600 (estimate: £30,000-50,000). A suite of Louis XVI cream-painted and parcel-gilt seat furniture by Matthieu Bauve, with upholstery almost certainly supplied by Pierre Delbée of Maison Jansen, Paris, sold for £336,400 (estimate: £120,000-180,000). Our thanks go to Orlando Rock and the whole team who made the auction such a success. We are delighted by the results which have raised substantial sums of money for the Medical Foundation and pay tribute to an extraordinary man and collector."
