Strong results were achieved for works by Roni Horn, Takashi Murakami, Conrad Marca-Relli, and Yue Minjun, and collectors responded enthusiastically to Andy Warhol's Flowers, which at \$1,082,500, was the auction's top lot and the second highest price obtained for a work sold in an off-season sale of this category at Christie's. It was particularly gratifying to see vivacious bidding for Raoul de Keyser's Depart, which was estimated \$15,000-20,000 and ultimately sold for \$68,500. The sale totaled over \$4.4 million, surpassing the spring First Open sale by over \$1 million. We look forward to Christie's Post-War & Contemporary Art sales in London on 16 and 17 October and in New York on 10 and 11 November."
