The Orientalist section delivered top prices and several new world auctions records. Particularly noteworthy was the one for von Ferraris which shattered the previous record of \$374,400 set at Christie’s last year. Christie’s position as market leader in this very much ‘en vogue’ field was comfortably confirmed. The 19<sup>th</sup> Century European paintings category witnessed strong results for the French academic painters in particular. Bidding was truly international throughout the sale and 10 new world auction records were realized.”
