

**HONG KONG** – This November in Hong Kong, Christie's will offer an outstanding collection of Chinese paintings at auction, including works by classical masters to modern-day pioneers. The **South Marsh** by **Lu Zhi**, and **The Fragrance of a Nation in Clearing Spring** by **Yun Shouping** from The Wong Nan-Ping Family Collection, will lead the **Fine Chinese Classical Paintings and Calligraphy** sale on the 29<sup>th</sup> while **Living in the Mountains** by **Zhang Daqian** will be the top lot of the **Fine Chinese Modern and Contemporary Ink Paintings** sale on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

Kim Yu, International Specialist Head of Chinese Paintings, remarked: "This season, in addition to offering a line-up of masterpieces, we are excited to continue Christie's longstanding tradition of bringing the finest and most prominent private collections to auction. Numerous highlights from these collections were passed down through generations, such as those from The Wong Nan-Ping Family Collection, The Ye Gongchuo Family Collection, and The Hosokawa Family Collection, and have been sought after by the academic and collecting community alike. The offerings not only shed light on the exceptional taste of these important connoisseurs but also showcase a stunning range of styles and techniques from important artists and scholars across generations."


The Fine Chinese Classical Paintings and Calligraphy sale presents an opportunity for collectors to acquire paintings that celebrate the historical art traditions of China. Highlights will lead the sale from three iconic collections: *The South Marsh* by Lu Zhi and *The Fragrance of a Nation in Clearing Spring* by Yun Shouping from The Wong Nan-Ping Family collection; *Calligraphy* by Huang Daozhou and *Landscapes / Flowers* by Fu Shan and Fu Mei from The Ye Gongchuo Family collection; and also *Mountain Retreat*, a 15-metre long handscroll by Shen Shichong and *Poems in Cursive Script Calligraphy* by Li Dongyang from The Hosokawa Family collection, all of which are legendary historical works.

The selection of works offered in the Fine Chinese Modern and Contemporary Ink Paintings sale represent the best of the category. Leading the sale is *Living in the Mountains* by Zhang Daqian (see below), as well as a series of exquisite works by Lin Fengmian and Wu Guanzhong, the two masters who created a unique ink painting style by fusing Chinese and Western art forms and techniques. Other artworks with rich provenance include *Zhongkui* by Qi Baishi which was previously in the Feng Wen Tang collection, *Ink Lotus* and *Boating on Mountain Lake* by Zhang Daqian which were previously part of the Belgian collection "Dongxi Studio", and *Panel Screens of Flowers and Calligraphy* by Wu Changshuo / Kusakabe Meikaku from a Japanese Private Collection. Li Huayi and Liu Kuo-Sung, the giants of contemporary ink, will lead this section of the sale along with Hong Kong new ink pioneers in the 1970s Lu Shou Kwan and Fang Zhaolin.

### **The Wong Nan-Ping Family Collection**

Christie's Hong Kong is proud to present selected paintings from the family collection of the last true traditional literati collector — The Master of the Jade Studio, Mr. Wong Nan-Ping (1924–1985). His collection was built over a lifetime of devoted searching and studying, informed by his expansive knowledge of Chinese paintings and literature, guided by his long-held principles, and recognized by all as one of the most distinguished collections of classical Chinese paintings and calligraphy. His artistic taste reflects an inner-self with the same qualities as the artists he admired and works he treasured. The Wong Nan-ping family collection has been sought after by museums and scholars for over a half century.

### The Ye Gongchuo Family Collection

As a pioneer in developing transportation and education in China, Ye Gongchuo was a renowned Chinese antiquarian and a connoisseur of Chinese paintings, calligraphy, and archaeology. His legacy as an ambassador and promoter of Chinese culture in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century is indisputable. The paintings and calligraphy in this collection have been carefully preserved and treasured by his only daughter, Julia Yeh, for over half a century. Fifteen classical works from the cherished collection of paintings and calligraphy will be offered in the **Fine Chinese Classical Paintings and Calligraphy** auction on 29 November, while three modern works will be offered in the **Fine Chinese Modern and Contemporary Ink Paintings** auction on 30 November.

#### The Hosokawa Family Collection

The Hosokawa Family is an important family in politics and the arts in the Higo Kumamoto Domain on Kyushu Island. The 16<sup>th</sup> generation family patriarch, Hosokawa Moritatsu (1883-1970), is credited with diversifying the family's collection to include a various Asian works of art and establishing the museum, Eisei Bunko. His son, Hosokawa Morisada (1912-2005) was a student of renowned Kyoto-school sinologist Kanō Naoki (1868-1947), who inspired him to start collecting Chinese paintings, calligraphy, and antiques. Christie's is honoured to be entrusted by the Hosokawa family with the sale of thirteen Chinese classical paintings and calligraphy. Besides, the **Important Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art** auction on 3 December will present several Chinese artworks in the same collection.
