FOREVER CELEBRATES REMARKABLE INAUGURAL SALE RESULTS A TOTAL OF RMB 97 MILLION / US\$ 12.1 MILLION REALIZED

The top lot of the day is *White Poplar Woods* by Wu Guanzhong (born 1919) which sold for RMB 6,720,000 / US\$ 832,722 after fierce bidding. This classic work depicts tree branches, each with a different presence that creates spaces suggestive of the scenery behind the poplar wood.

Also on offer is a selection of important works by Lin Fengmian (1900-1991), including *Four Beauties* which realized RMB 4,704,000 / US\$ 582,906.

Another highlight is *Horse Riding* by Huang Zhou (1925-1997) which achieved RMB 3,136,000 / US\$ 388,604. Huang was highly acclaimed for his vivid depiction of the daily life of ethnic groups.
