We are delighted with the result of the recently re-discovered Hokusai scroll painting, the whereabouts of which had been unknown for over 80 years; it realised £713,250, setting a world auction record not only for the artist, but also for a Japanese painting at auction. Works of art from private collections did well and the Burnie Craig collection of sword fittings was 99% sold. This sale concludes the very successful fortnight of Asian Art Week at Christie's London, winter 2008. We now look forward to the upcoming sales in Asian Art Week Hong Kong later this month.
