"The combined total for Ancient Jewelry, Ancient Egyptian Art from the Harer Family Trust, and Antiquities was \$14.5 million, the second highest total in the history of the department. The superb granite figure of Queen Nefertari set a world-record for an Egyptian work of art at auction at \$2,256,000, only to be eclipsed later by the spectacular Old Kingdom Egyptian group statue of Ka-nefer, which sold to the Kimbell Art Museum for the new world-record of \$2,816,000.
