COMMENT: "With the results in from yesterday's Antiquities sale and today's Ancient Jewelry sale, Christie's position as world-wide leader in the field of ancient art has been confirmed for the third year in a row, said G. Max Bernheimer, International Specialist Head of Antiquities. "In this week's sales, a healthy mix of private, trade and institutional buyers drove both sales. A fabulous Greek bronze corslet was the top lot in the Antiquities sale, coming in at \$207,500 against an estimate of \$50,000 to \$70,000, and a Greek gold and carnelian finger ring was tops in Ancient Jewelry, selling for \$35,850 against an estimate of \$8,000-12,000. The success of the New York sales, together with extraordinary sales in London, including \$11,652,176 for the Jenkins Venus, all contributed to making 2002 a triumph."

Christie's Antiquities auctions worldwide have realized a grand total of \$24,159,561 for the year 2002, a record annual total that surpasses the nearly \$20,000,000 total achieved in 2000.
