Comment: Darren Leak, Specialist and Head of Sale said:

"We were pleased with the results of the Post-War and Contemporary Art sale, which achieved strong prices for many individual works including those by Cildo Meireles, Jan Fabre and Banksy. The sale as a whole achieved £2,882,100 – a considerable increase on the equivalent sale in September 2010, resulting in a record year for the category at Christie's South Kensington saleroom - £6,221,400 for the two annual sales combined.

Buyers originated from 27 different countries, with the breakdown (by lot / by origin) as 68% Europe including UK, 25% Americas, 5% Asia and 2% Middle East. Three of the top ten lots listed above were sold online – lots 41, 141 and 170.

We look forward to Frieze week's Post-War and Contemporary auction at King Street, and the upcoming season in New York in November. Our next Post-War and Contemporary Art sale at South Kensington will take place in March 2012."
