Buyers eagerly snapped up both older vintages and large format bottles, again showing that collections here are broadening. We are pleased with this strong finish to the spring sales season and look forward to an exciting sale to open the fall season on 8 September in Hong Kong."

Simon Tam, Head of Wine for Christie's China added, "Our 16 June sale shows that wine knowledge in Greater China is growing rapidly. Burgundy, particularly DRC are clear favorites at the moment. We see that not only buyers from Beijing are becoming increasingly sophisticated, but rather wine knowledge and appreciation are also permeating into China's second tier cities, reflecting the increasingly diverse origins of our Chinese bidders."
