Autumn is the season in which collectors around the world traditionally replenish their wine cellars ahead of the holiday entertaining and gift-giving season, and between the three sales, there is a wealth of choices on offer to suit a variety of collecting tastes. The level of quality and extensive variety on offer this season consolidates Hong Kong's position as a global wine centre.

FINEST AND RAREST WINES FROM A FAMOUS PRIVATE CELLAR NOVEMBER 23, 2012, 6:00PM, SALE 2953

Leading the sales this autumn is the private collection of an internationally respected European connoisseur. Comprising over 240 lots, the sale will present collectors with a diverse selection of mature Bordeaux from 28 of the leading châteaux, as well as an assemblage of excellent Rhône. The sale offers an extensive assortment of classic vintages, starting with 2009 and dating as far back as 1799 *(Lot 3201)*, with nearly every other decade in between represented.

Beyond the celebrated First Growths, household names in the collection include Château Léoville Las Cases, L'Evangile, Pichon Longueville Comtesse de Lalande, Montrose, and Palmer, with a number of wines ready to be enjoyed now. Also included in the collection are classic vintages in large formats for long-term cellaring. The mature vintages from the last two hundred years are in pristine condition.

Tasting Note: One of the all-time greats and, at its best, a powerhouse. In fact, such a powerful and tannic wine that it was virtually undrinkable for half a century. Nevertheless, bottlings varied and, as always, provenance plays a part. Tasted on 18 occasions. The most magnificent were (and still can be) the Coningham-bottled magnums from Glamis Castle. Most recently, a magnum, deep, brown-rimmed but alive; spicy, eucalyptus yet not very exciting bouquet; excessively tannic and austere but improved in the glass. Last tasted August 2005. At best ****** (6 stars) M.B.

Last tasted September 2005. At best ***** M.B.

On November 24, Christie's Hong Kong will present a single-owner European collection consisting of the most comprehensive assortment of rare Burgundies and Rhône valley wines ever offered in Hong Kong. Comprising over 730 lots, the sale features renowned names rarely seen in Hong Kong, as well as an extensive variety of top cuvées.

Assembled over several decades by a passionate connoisseur, these Burgundy rarities span 60 vintages, ranging from 1959 to 2010. On offer are bottles from leading winemakers, including Henri Jayer, Domaine de la Romanée-Conti, Domaine Leroy, Coche-Dury, Armand Rousseau, and Georges Roumier. The lot consists of 60 cases made up of 12 vintages (in total 720 bottles), from each of the following châteaux: Latour, Lafite, Margaux, Mouton Rothschild and Haut Brion, ranging from the year 1991 to 2002. The sale also features an ex-cellar consignment from one of the top winemakers of the Rhône Valley, Maison M. Chapoutier. Other vinous treasures include a selection of mature Bordeaux, DRC, Leroy and Tuscans.
