South Kensington – Christie's is delighted to announce the sale of the *Collection of Sandro and Lidia Orsi, Ca' Mera, Varese* and of the *Property from the Collection of an Aristocratic Lombard Family*, to be offered at auction together in the London, South Kensington saleroom on 19 July.

Both collections comprise a wide range of decorative and fine arts representing their respective owners' eclectic taste. The works of art offered are characterized by a dash of dramatic fantasy, with the homes they adorned having been decorated to exude a certain theatrical flavour. Highlights include an 18^{th} century North Italian giltwood and silvered overmantel mirror (estimate: £30,000-40,000), and a George III ormolu-mounted tortoiseshell veneered striking and musical eight-day table clock (estimate: £20,000-30,000). Further lots spanning several centuries are offered with estimates ranging from £400 to £40,000.

THE COLLECTION OF SANDRO AND LIDIA ORSI, CA' MERA, VARESE

Regarded as one of the most beautiful homes in Lombardy, Ca' Mera, the country house of Sandro and Lidia Orsi was filled with beautiful objects from many different epochs. A renowned antiquarian and tastemaker from Milan, over his lifetime Sandro Orsi collected a very selective group of furniture, paintings, works of art and natural history specimens. Sandro and his wife Lidia revived the Renaissance and Baroque character of the house and instilled their own unique vision into the interiors, which culminated with the creation of a *Kunst* – or *Wunderkammer*.

"I have never seen such an example of poetical taste", Sir John Pope-Hennessy said after visiting the Orsi house.
