London - Christie's is pleased to announce the two-day sale of *Fine and Rare Burgundy and other Fine Wines* that will take place at King Street, London, on the 7 & 8 November 2013. A celebration of Burgundy, the sale features one of the finest private collections of wines from the Domaine de la Romanée-Conti that Christie's has brought to auction. Comprising 921 lots overall, this stellar sale is expected to realise in the region of £2 million.

Noah May, Wine Specialist, London commented: "*We are thrilled to present our sale of Fine and Rare Burgundy and Other Fine Wines – this is a catalogue filled with superb, compelling wines. The sale is a fantastic opportunity for collectors to find rare Burgundy with perfect provenance from some of the greatest vintages in recent memory*".

The sale is led by a magnificent collection comprising 156 lots, which include some of the finest Burgundies ever bottled and covers many of the most iconic producers from the Côte de Nuits, focusing on the villages of Vosne-Romanée and Gevrey-Chambertin. These bottles have been collected by a connoisseur who has strong links to the greatest Domaines including: Rousseau, Roumier, Comte George de Vogüé and Leflaive; almost all the wines were purchased direct, on release.

Further highlights offered are an array of wines from the Domaine de la Romanée-Conti. This spectacular collection includes three bottles of the fabled Romanée-Conti 1990 (estimate: £21,000-27,000) in addition to

other rarities such as; a full case of Musigny 2005 from J.F. Mugnier (estimate: £7,000-9,000), and six bottles of Chambertin, Clos de Bèze 2005, Rousseau (estimate: £3,600-4,800).
