Christie's Amsterdam is the only saleroom to achieve strong results in both the regional and the global market for Post-War and Contemporary Art, as demonstrated by the results for well-known international artists such as Christopher Wool, Joseph Beuys, Yves Klein and Mark Manders. Again Christie's Amsterdam demonstrates that it is in the lead for Zero artists as Jan Schoonhoven and Walter Leblanc, and CoBrA artists as Constant, Jorn and Karel Appel. As a result of the internationalization of Amsterdam sales, more than 20 nationalities have been active in the saleroom through fierce telephone and online bidding."
