€2,5M for Paris' inaugural handbags auction Second sale scheduled for fall



Paris – Following the very strong results obtained during the inaugural sale on Monday 9 March, Christie's Paris is planning a second sale for September. Indeed, the impressive results achieved demonstrate that the Parisian market is ready to welcome this new category twice per year.

Under the direction of Matthew Rubinger, international head of the handbags department, Christie's launched its first sale in Hong Kong last November totaling €1,4M and right in the middle of Paris Fashion Week, it seems that the timing was perfect yet again. This new sale featured pieces such as the Hermès Himalaya Birkin which was sold for €157,500, a record for this model. The sale also offered two important metallic handbags including a Tricolor Kelly 28, made especially for the Faubourg Saint-Honoré Hermès store window (sold €91,500 against a pre-sale estimate of 10,000-20,000), and a metallic silver ostrich Birkin 30, that was sold for €79,500.

Collectors from Europe, Asia, Russia and the Middle East were present in the auction room and on the phones to place their bids on these pieces.

Matthew Rubinger, International head of the department: "I am thrilled with the results obtained on March 9th. We doubled our pre-sale estimate and broke worldwide auction records. For a first auction organised in Paris, these results are extremely encouraging and we are excited to start putting together a great second sale for next fall".
