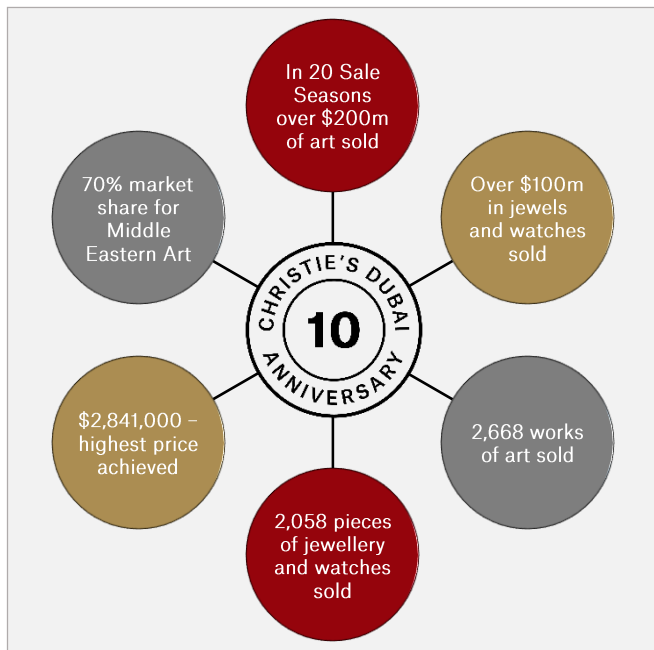



Celebrating 10 Years of Christie's Auctions in Dubai 2006-2016





Since April 2008, Christie's has held the record for the most expensive Middle Eastern work of art sold at auction: Parviz Tanavoli, *The Wall (Oh Persepolis)*, 1975, which sold for \$2,841,000, a world record price for the artist at auction



A very rare Patek Philippe platinum and 18k pink gold automatic calendar wristwatch sold in March 2015 for \$461,000, becoming the most expensive watch sold in Dubai

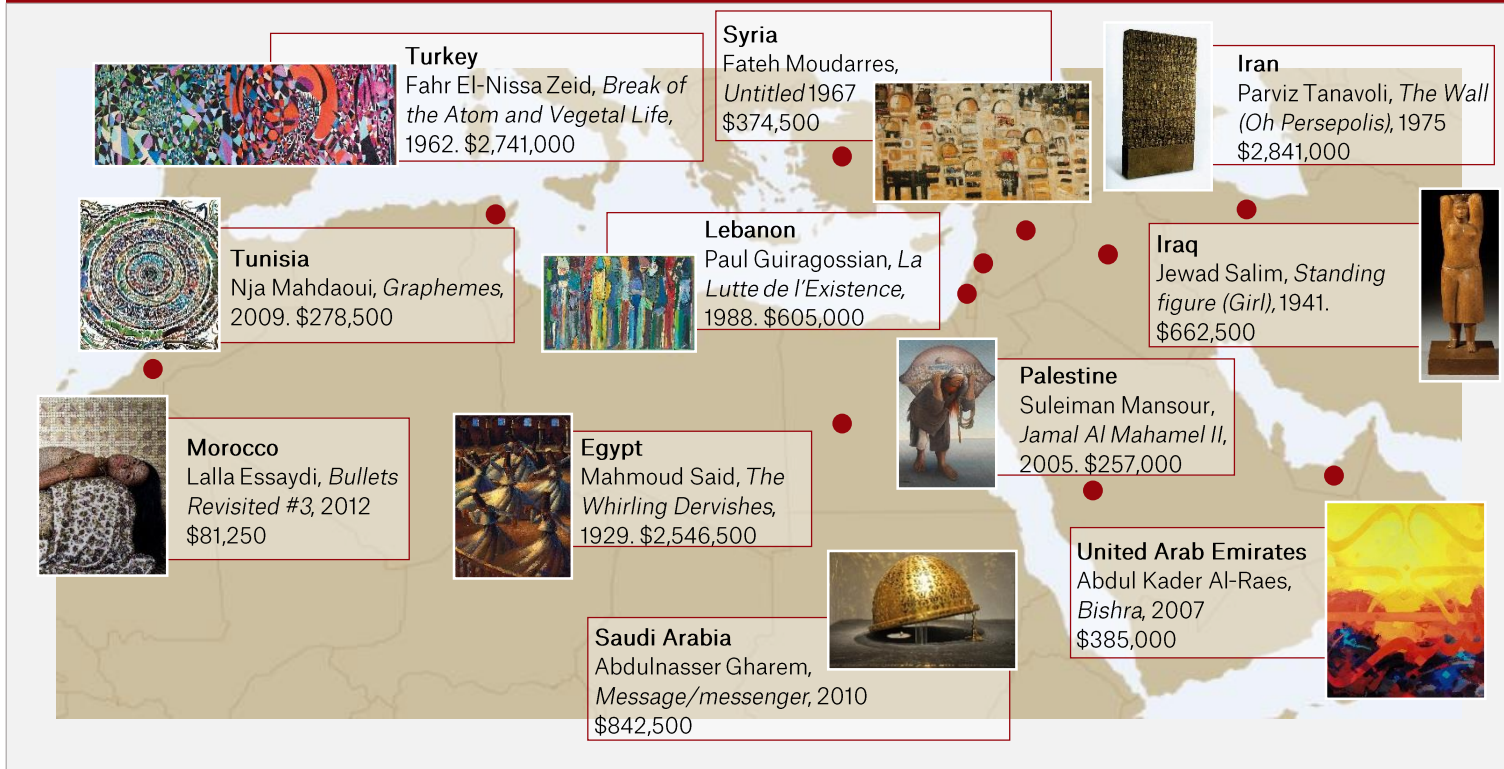


The iconic *Umm Kulthum* 9 row Indian natural pearl necklace sold in April 2008, achieving \$1,385,000

Top Middle Eastern Artworks by Country Sold in Christie's Dubai's 10 Year History



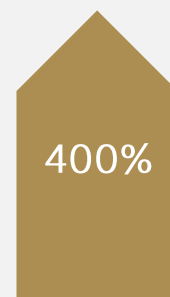
