London – Christie's, EON Productions, Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Studios and Twentieth Century Fox Home Entertainment are pleased to announce the 24 lots to be offered in *James Bond Spectre – The Auction*, all of which can be viewed in the auction e-catalogue <a href="here">here</a>. These 24 items of *Spectre* memorabilia come directly from the archives of EON Productions, together with unique donations from Daniel Craig, Sam Mendes, Michael G. Wilson, Barbara Broccoli, Jesper Christensen and Sam Smith. All proceeds from the auctions will benefit Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF), other charitable organisations and the United Nations Mine Action Service (UNMAS).

The online-only sale will offer 14 lots and open for bidding from Tuesday 16 to Tuesday 23 February at <a href="mailto:christies.com/spectreonline">christies.com/spectreonline</a>. The invitation-only live auction will be held on Thursday 18 February at Christie's King Street and will offer a further 10 lots, accessible to all via both internet and telephone

bids. Estimates start at £1,000 and range up to £1,000,000, presenting James Bond fans with a rare opportunity to acquire memorabilia from the 24th film in the James Bond series.

## WATCHES FROM SPECTRE



The live auction and online-only sale feature wristwatches worn in *Spectre* by Daniel Craig as James Bond, Ralph Fiennes as M and Dave Bautista as Hinx.

The live auction presents an Omega Seamaster 300 watch, worn by Daniel Craig (estimate: £15,000-20,000, *illustrated above, far left*), the proceeds of this lot will be donated to UNMAS; and a Longines 'Conquest Heritage' 18-carat rose gold automatic wristwatch, worn by Ralph Fiennes (estimate: £5,000-7,000, *illustrated above, second from left*).

The online-only sale presents a further two watches: a Swiss high-tech ceramic Rado D-Star automatic chronograph wristwatch, worn by Dave Bautista (estimate: £4,000–6,000, *illustrated above, second from right*), and an Omega Seamaster 300 limited edition watch gifted by Michael G. Wilson and Barbara Broccoli with personalised engraved message donated by Jesper Christensen (estimate: £7,000–9,000, *illustrated above, far right*). The proceeds of this lot will be donated to the Danish Refugee Council.

### PROPS FROM SPECTRE





Both the live auction and online-only sale present a selection of props used in *Spectre*. This includes a *Spectre* Clapper Board used during filming and signed by Daniel Craig (estimate: £2,000-3,000, *illustrated above, far left*); a prop 'gift' phone sent by James Bond to Moneypenny, who is played by



Naomie Harris (estimate: £2,000-3,000, *illustrated page 2, center*); and a Martini Shaker and two glasses used in the iconic Martini scene, when Bond and Madeleine Swann are travelling on a train through the Moroccan desert (estimate: £2,000-3,000, *illustrated page 2, far right*).

The online-only sale includes a Q Branch DB10 Gadget Switch made by Prop Shop at Pinewood Studios for *Spectre*. In the film Bond takes the Aston Martin DB10 from Q branch and heads to Rome to pursue his lead, where he tests the switches during a high speed chase (estimate: £2,000-3,000, *illustrated left*).

# COSTUMES FROM SPECTRE





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The auctions present costumes worn in *Spectre* by Daniel Craig, Christoph Waltz and Stephanie Sigman. Included in the live auction on 18 February is a Day of the Dead costume worn in the pre-title sequence of the film by Daniel Craig, when Bond and Estrella celebrate the Day of the Dead parade. The costume includes a black frock coat, skull mask, leather gloves, top hat and skull cane (estimate: £12,000–18,000, *illustrated above, left*). Also offered in the live auction is a Spectre 9 carat gold ring made for the film, worn by Christoph Waltz as Oberhauser (estimate: £4,000–6,000, *illustrated below*); and a two-piece dinner suit by Tom Ford, worn by Daniel Craig in the Moroccan train dinner scene (estimate: £20,000–30,000, *illustrated above, right*).



The online-only sale features the mask and flower head dress worn by Stephanie Sigman as Estrella (estimate: £1,000–1,500, *illustrated above, left*); a costume worn by Christoph Waltz as Oberhauser in his Moroccan lair (estimate: £6,000–8,000); initialed 'JB' Tom Ford cufflinks worn by Daniel Craig (estimate: £2,000–3,000); and Bond's shoulder holster (estimate: £3,000–5,000).
