24 LOTS OF JAMES BOND MEMORABILIA CELEBRATE THE 24TH BOND FILM RELEASED ON DIGITAL HD, BLU-RAYTM & DVD

London – Christie's, EON Productions, Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Studios and Twentieth Century Fox Home Entertainment present a rare opportunity to acquire memorabilia from the 24th film in the James Bond series this February to celebrate the release of *Spectre* on Digital HD, Blu-ray[™] and DVD. A live auction and an online-only sale will together present 24 lots of *Spectre* memorabilia direct from the archives of EON Productions, with unique donations from Daniel Craig, Sam Mendes, Michael G. Wilson, Barbara Broccoli, Jesper Christensen and Sam Smith. The online-only sale will offer 14 lots and open for bidding from Tuesday 16 to Tuesday 23 February at christies.com/spectreonline. The



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invitation-only live auction will be held on Thursday 18 February at Christie's King Street and will offer 10 lots, accessible to all via both internet and telephone bids. All proceeds from the auctions will benefit Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF), other charitable organisations and the United Nations Mine Action Service (UNMAS).

The live auction on 18 February is led by an Aston Martin DB10, one of the series of DB10s designed and engineered by Aston Martin exclusively for James Bond, Spectre, illustrated top left. Most of the DB10s were modified for use in the filming of Spectre, but two of those produced were kept back as show cars, for display purposes only, and this is one of them*. The car is expected to realise between £1,000,000 and £1,500,000 and is to date the only DB10 to be released for public sale by EON Productions and Aston Martin. This is the only car that includes a special plaque signed by Daniel Craig and was displayed at the world premiere of Spectre at the Royal Albert Hall, London. Aston Martin has been associated with the James Bond franchise for over 50 years, with the DB10 model featuring in the latest Bond film, Spectre.

Further highlights in the live auction include an Omega Seamaster 300 watch, worn by Daniel Craig as James Bond in *Spectre* (estimate: £15,000-20,000). The proceeds of this lot will be donated to UNMAS. The online-only auction features the laptop used by Ben Whishaw as Q (estimate: £4,000-6,000, *illustrated left, second from top*); and a pair of Tom Ford 'Snowdon' sunglasses worn by Daniel Craig as James Bond (estimate: £4,000-6,000, *illustrated left, second from bottom*).

The live auction and online-only sale will both take place in the same month that Spectre is released on Digital HD, Blu-rayTM and DVD in the U.S. (9 February) and in the UK (22 February). Included in the live auction is a Spectre Blu-rayTM, signed by Daniel Craig, which is offered

together with a pair of James Bond's blue initialed 'JB' Tom Ford cufflinks worn by Daniel Craig in the opening scene of the film (estimate: £3,000-5,000, *illustrated page two, bottom left*).

David Linley, Honorary Chairman, Christie's EMERI, commented: "As a life-long James Bond fan it gives me great pleasure for Christie's to be part of this James Bond Spectre charity auction, celebrating the 24th film in the franchise. All proceeds of the auction will benefit Médecins Sans Frontières and other charitable organisations. We are proud to continue Cubby Broccoli's philosophy of giving something back."

From Tuesday 16 February at 3 pm GMT / 10 am EST, 14 lots will be offered in an online-only auction: *James Bond Spectre - Online*. The online-only auction will be open for bidding for one week, closing on Tuesday 23 February from 3 pm GMT / 10 am EST. Proceeds of the auction will benefit Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF) and other charitable organisations.

Live auction - Christie's King Street

On the evening of Thursday 18 February a live charity auction, *James Bond Spectre - The Auction*, will offer ten lots, including an Aston Martin DB10 and an Omega Seamaster 300 watch, worn by Daniel Craig. Proceeds of the auction will benefit Médecins Sans Frontières (MSF), other charitable organisations and the United Nations Mine Action Service (UNMAS). The auction will be by invitation only at Christie's King Street. Bidders can participate in the sale via telephone and Christie's LIVETM.

The vehicle is not roadworthy, has not been approved for use on public roads and has not undergone the testing process used for production vehicles, including but not limited to occupant safety, crash testing, durability and/or emissions of aftersales maintenance regimes.

The DB10 was unveiled to the public on 4 December, 2014 by Director Sam Mendes on the Albert R. Broccoli 007 Stage at Pinewood Studios. It is to date the only DB10 to be released for public sale by EON Productions and Aston Martin. The other 9 cars will be used for exhibition and publicity by EON Productions and Aston Martin. In the film – it is revealed to Bond (Daniel Craig) by Q (Ben Whishaw) in his Mechanical Workshop – the car is intended for Agent 009 however 007 borrows it before it has been handed over – leaving Q a bottle of Bollinger in its place. He takes it to Rome to attend a funeral in pursuit of more information. Bond is later discovered having infiltrated a secret *Spectre* meeting and makes a speedy escape in the DB10 with henchman Hinx hot on his heels through the streets of Rome and along the River Tiber.
