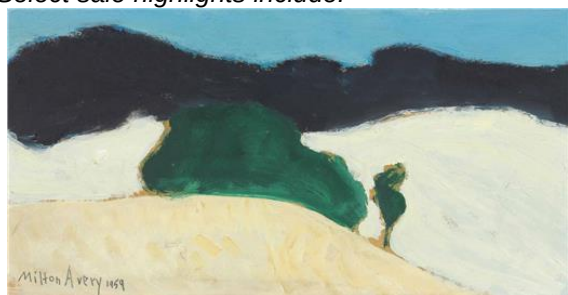

CHRISTIE'S AMERICAN ART ONLINE AUCTION MARCH 14 - 23

New York – Christie's announces the mid-season American Art auction will take place on a digital platform for the first time, from March 14-23. All lots will be on view to the public March 19-23 at Christie's Rockefeller Center Galleries. With works spanning from the late 19th century through the end of the 20th century, the March American Art sale comprises an impressive breadth of artists, movements, media and price points. Among the artists featured in the sale are works by Milton Avery, Mary Cassatt, William Merritt Chase, Arthur Dove, Thomas Eakins, Winslow Homer, Thomas Moran, Norman Rockwell, Andrew Wyeth and NC Wyeth. With 94 lots offered and estimates ranging from \$800 to \$250,000, the sale presents a fantastic opportunity for new and established collectors alike.

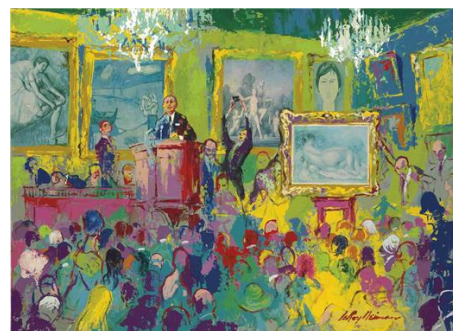

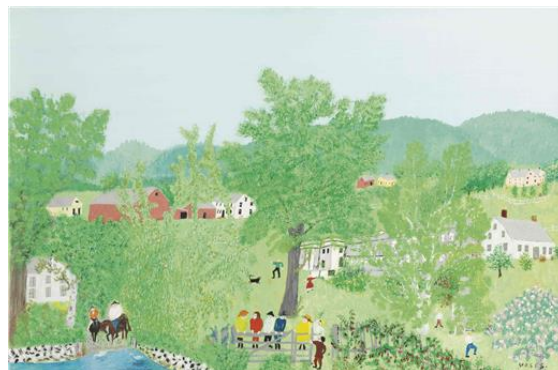
