PRESS PREVIEW MARCH 9 AT 3PM PUBLIC EXHIBITION OPENS MARCH 10 SALE DATES: MARCH 14-17



New York – Christie's announces <u>Asian Art Week</u>, a series of auctions, viewings, and events, from March 10-17. This season presents seven distinct sales spanning all epochs and categories of Asian Art. Led by distinguished private collections, the highly anticipated series features an unprecedented offering of *huanghuali* and *zitan* classical Chinese furniture from The Marie Theresa L. Virata Collection, Shang and Zhou dynasty ritual bronzes and Song dynasty paintings from the Fujita Museum and a group of Song-Qing dynasty porcelains from the Indianapolis Museum of Art. South Asian highlights are led by a monumental black stone figure of *Lokanatha Avalokiteshvara* from Pala-period India, formerly at the Boston Museum of Fine Arts in 1922, as well as a gilt silver figure of the *Sixth Shamarpa* and much more.

Fine Chinese Paintings 14 March | 10am | New York

Christie's sale of *Fine Chinese Paintings* features over 100 lots of classical, modern, and contemporary works from collections from the west. Leading the sale is **Qi Baishi (1863-1957)**, *Portrait of Li Tieguai* (estimate: \$220,000-340,000). Additional highlights include **Ni Zan (1301-1374)** *Landscape- A Gift to Ban Yun* (estimate: \$150,000-300,000) and **Zhang (Daqian (1899-1983)** *Boating Among Hills* (estimate: \$70,000-100,000). On March 15, a selection of masterworks of Chinese painting will also be offered in the sale of *Important Chinese Art from the Fujita Museum*.

Indian, Himalayan and Southeast Asian Works of Art 14 March | 2pm | New York

Christie's sale of *Indian, Himalayan and Southeast Asian Works of Art* will present over 50 carefully chosen lots featuring an array of fine bronzes and sculptures from Gandhara, India, the Himalayas, and Southeast Asia. The sale is led by a **Large and Important Black Stone Figure of** *Lokanatha Avalokiteshvara* (estimate upon request), which was one of the first pieces of Indian art acquired by the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston, where it was a part of the permanent collection from 1922-1935.

Important Chinese Art from the Fujita Museum 15 March | 7pm | New York

On March 15, Christie's will offer Important Chinese Art from the Fujita Museum, a selection of 31 Chinese works of art, including highly important Shang and Zhou dynasty ritual bronzes, classical paintings, Buddhist stone sculptures, celadons and scholar's objects. All of the works were collected by Denzaburō Fujita (1841–1912) and his two sons, Heitarō Fujita and Tokujirō Fujita, who were amongst the premier collectors of Asian art the Kansai region of Japan. Until World War II, the Fujita family acquired Chinese art exclusively through leading dealers Yamanaka & Company, for Chinese works of art, and Tanimatsuya (Toda Gallery), for Japanese art and tea wares. All of the Chinese objects in the sale were in the Fujita Collection prior to 1940.

The Harris Collection: Important Early Chinese Art 16 March | 2pm | New York

Christie's New York is delighted to present The Harris Collection: Important Early Chinese Art, a group of over 80 lots from the collection of Erwin and Therese Harris. Since 1960's, Erwin Harris had a passion for Chinese works of art and became a scholar and connoisseur in the field and acquired works from notable dealers such as J.J. Lally, Guiseppe Eskanazi, and Charlotte Horstmann. The works selected for sale in March, mainly from the Shang and Han dynasties, are highlighted by a very rare and important bronze horse harness frontlet, Northwest China, 6th century BC, (estimate: \$150,000-250,000) and a very rare gilt-bronze feline-form ornament, North China, 1st - 2nd century AD (estimate: \$15,000-25,000).

Fine Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art 17 March | 10am & 2pm | New York

Fine Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art will be held on March 17 and comprises approximately 290 lots, representing works from a variety of collecting categories, including early bronzes, a range of ceramics, jades, and works of art. Highlights include an unusual jade carving of a melon, 18th century (estimate: \$400,000-600,000); a very rare small bronze phoenix-form ewer, late westernearly eastern Zhou dynasty, 8th-7th century BC (estimate: \$300,000-500,000); and a very rare famille rose 'hundred deer' vase, Qianlong period (1736-1795) (estimate: \$300,000-500,000).
