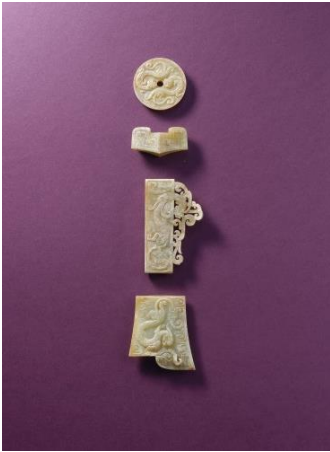
Spring Chinese Ceramics & Works of Art Auctions at Christie's Hong Kong Totalled HK\$422,405,000/US\$54,490,329

49% Lots Above High Estimate

On 31 May 2017, Christie's Hong Kong held four auctions for Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art - *Adorning the Kings - A Private Collection of Archaic Jade Ornaments*, *The Perfect Countenance - Fine Buddhist Works of Art*, *The Yongzheng Emperor's Double-Dragon Amphora stand alone sale*, *The Imperial Sale/ Important Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art* together realised a total of HK\$422,405,000/US\$54,490,329.

The top highlight from this series of sales was *An Exceptionally Fine Tang-Style 'Double-Dragon' Celadon-Glazed Amphora*, which achieved HK\$140,540,000/ US\$18,129,688. Please click [HERE](#) for the results of the sale.

The top lot for the sale was an *Important Set of Three Jade ‘Chilong’ Sword Fittings and a Jade Sword Guard, Western Han Dynasty (206 BC – 8 AD)*, which realised **HK\$8,460,000/ US\$1,090,982**.

The top lot for the sale was a *Highly Important and Very Rare Malla-Style Gilt-Bronze and Silver-Inlaid Seated Figure of Buddha Shakyamuni, Tibet, 13th-14th Century*, which realised **HK\$50,940,000/ US\$6,571,270**.
