CHRISTIE'S GENEVA LUXURY AUCTIONS

TOTAL FOR THE SPRING 2018 SEASON CHF 98,153,210 / \$98,157,500

Geneva – The Christie's Geneva May series of sales achieved a combined total of CHF98,153,210 / \$98,157,500, attracting over 2,500 visitors to the Four Seasons Hotel des Bergues. The three sales had registered bidders from 57 countries and of the total registrants 20% were new to Christie's. Magnificent Jewels auction concluded the series of sales, featuring a selection of exceptional items, with 16 lots selling over 1 million and the total sale achieving CHF81,620,500/\$81,620,500.

Leading the sale was a *superb* D-Colour *diamond ring of 50.47 carats, by Harry Winston,* which sold for CHF6,500,000 / \$6,500,000. Further highlights included: a *spectacular fancy vivid yellow diamond ring of 20.49 carats*, achieving a near record price per carat for a total of CHF5,487,500 / \$5,587,500, a *fancy intense purplish pink diamond ring* of 8.52 carats selling for CHF6,275,000 / \$6,275,000 and *an important late 19th century emerald and diamond necklace, by Tiffany & Co., circa 1880*, which was originally sold at Christie's New York, over 20 years ago and today realised CHF1,572,500/ \$1,572,500.

Following on from the success of Christie's single owner sale, "Beyond Boundaries: Magnificent Jewels from a European Collection" in November 2017, pieces from the Art Nouveau and Art Déco periods reaffirmed their place on the international market. The Art Nouveau top lot was lot 205, a glass and enamel necklace by Renée Lalique, which sold for CHF187,500 / \$187,500. The Art Déco top lots were *both by* Van Cleef & Aprels, two almost



identical bracelets, the first a *sapphire and diamond bracelet*, and the second a *ruby and diamond bracelet*, each selling for CHF1,332,500 / \$1,332,500.

Retro jewels were also very prominent in the sale with 24 pieces being on offer, a *Retro sapphire and diamond bangle by Boucheron, circa 1937* was the top lot and sold for CHF106,250/\$106,250. Rounding up the selection of pieces within the sale were an exquisite number of animal themed items, *with a coloured diamond, diamond and emerald 'lion couché' shoulder brooch by René Boivin* being a key highlight and selling for CHF456,500 / \$456,500.

Rahul Kadakia, International Head of Jewellery comments, "The inaugural GemGenève jewellery fair attracted 140 exhibitors and many new faces to Geneva, adding to the spirited activity at the sales all week long. White diamonds, in particular showed great demand, alongside blue and pink stones and top vintage jewels."

François Curiel, Chairman Europe and Asia, comments "The Spring 2018 auctions marked another successful sale season in Christie's 50 year long history selling in Geneva. For the last half a century Christie's Switzerland has connected collectors across the world to experience owning beautiful objects from art to jewellery and watches to wine. 50 years of knowledge and passion has elevated Christie's into a leading position of the Swiss Art market."

The top lot of the section and the entire sale was Patek Philippe's "*Grand Complication*" reference 5208P selling for CHF750,500 / \$750,000. It is one of Patek Philippe's most complicated wristwatches ever made, offered exclusively to the firm's top clients. Preserved like new, the present platinum reference 5208P is only the second example to come to auction.

FINEST & RAREST WINES



Sale total: CHF4,290,960 / \$4,295,250 Sold 86 % by value and 88% by lot

The top lot of the sale was a case of 12 bottles of Château Latour 1945, selling for CHF120,000 / \$120,178, the highest price for a single lot achieved since 2015 and most probable the new world auction record for any original wooden case of 12 bottles of Chateau Latour. It is one of the best Château Latour, with a distinct flavor, the wine encompasses thirty notes made over five decades.

Today, Christie's holds twice a year jewellery, watches and wine auctions in Geneva and once a year a dedicated Swiss Art auction in Zurich. Over the past 50 years, Christie's offered the most valuable private jewellery collections, such as the collection of Mrs. Lily Safra as well as the most prestigious stones such as the Oppenheimer Blue or Le Grand Mazarin. Christie's watches organized the Patek Philippe 175 anniversary auction and is the partner of choice of ONLY WATCH, the biggest charity auction in the world of Horlogere. In Zurich, the team offered the private collections of Bruno Giacometti, the Zumsteg collection as well as the Swiss Art collection of Ernst Beyerle, to benefit The Beyerle Foundation in Bale.
