New York – Christie's achieved a grand total of \$683.3 million (£532.8 million / €619.7 million) across the eight auctions that comprise its flagship autumn 20th Century Week series in New York. Sell-through rates were consistently strong across the Evening and Day sales (see chart on page 3), signaling steady demand from global collectors for modern and contemporary artworks of great quality, rarity and exceptional provenance.

Marc Porter, Chairman, Christie's Americas: "We are very satisfied with the results achieved across the week. Our sales totals finished well within pre-sale expectations and we saw extraordinarily strong and consistent sell-through rates across the sales. Our overall success this week is a credit to our teams and their ability to manage these sales for success, and to our consignors, who entrusted us with their collections and took our guidance on how best to sell their property amidst this fall's more tumultuous macroeconomic climate."

The week opened with the Evening Sale of Impressionist and Modern art, where the top lot of the evening sale was René Magritte's Le Seize Septembre, which realized \$19,570,000. Umberto Boccioni's Futurist masterpiece Forme uniche della continuità nello spazio (Unique Forms of Continuity in Space) set a new world auction record for the artist when it sold for \$16,165,000. Surrealist works were pursued by collectors across price ranges this season, with Salvador Dali claiming the highest prices in Christie's Day and Works on Paper sales on Tuesday, with Femmes aux papillons selling for \$939,000 in the Works on Paper Sale and Décor pour Roméo et Juliette realizing \$1,119,000 in the Day Sale.

A companion online-only auction of <u>Picasso Ceramics</u> was 100% sold and realized a total of \$1,774,750. Read our in-depth report on the Impressionist and Modern Art sales <u>here</u>.

Known for its innovative additions to the traditional sale week, Christie's featured a special mid-week auction entitled <u>La Ménagerie</u>, a curated assemblage of **20**<sup>th</sup> **Century design** and sculpture devoted to animal forms, featuring artists such as Francois-Xavier Lalanne, Diego Giacometti, Alexander Calder, Rembrandt Bugatti, and François Pompon. The unique sale, a collaboration between Christie's Design and Impressionist and Modern Art teams, totaled \$10,915,250, selling 84% by lot and 93% by value. The top lot of the sale was Lalanne's fully functional, one-of-a-kind bathtub in the form of a <u>Hippopotamus</u> which sold for \$4,335,000 against a pre-sale high estimate of \$1,500,000.

Christie's **Post-War and Contemporary Art** auctions provided a rousing finish to the week, with collectors from 31 countries converging at Rockefeller Center on Wednesday evening. <u>Ed Ruscha's Hurting the Word Radio #2</u> and <u>Andy Warhol's portrait of Muhammad Ali</u> delivered a one-two punch, fetching \$52,485,000 — a new auction record for Ruscha – and \$10,036,000, respectively. The total for the <u>evening sale</u> soared to \$325,259,750, and was 89% sold by lot, 96% by value

Finishing the week, the Post-War and Contemporary Art Day sales **achieved the highest ever day sale total in auction history**, with a combined total of \$117,126,225 for the morning and afternoon sessions, with works by **Ruth Asawa**, **George Condo**, **Frank Stella**, **Andy Warhol**, and **Joan Mitchell** all achieving prices over the \$3 million mark.
