

Christie's Hong Kong Chinese Paintings Autumn Sales Presents Exemplary Works by Renowned Artists from the Classical to the Contemporary

HONG KONG - From classical masters to modern-day pioneers, Christie's will offer an outstanding collection of Chinese paintings for auction on the 25th and 26th November 2019. The selection of works beautifully capture the highest levels of achievement in Chinese paintings across time, and are featured in three sales **Fine Chinese Classical Paintings** and **Calligraphy**, **Fine Chinese Modern Paintings**, and **Chinese Contemporary Ink**.

Showcasing a wide range of distinctive styles and techniques from meticulous *gongbi* to monumental splashed ink, highlights from this season include: classical compositions from **Shen Zhou**, **Ren Xiong** and **Bada Shanren**; works by modern masters such as, **Zhang Daqian**, **Wu Guanzhong**, and **Fu Baoshi**; as well as innovative contemporary ink paintings by **Liu Kuo-sung**, **Liu Dan** and **Li Huayi**.

CLASSICAL HIGHLIGHTS

Leading the offering of classical paintings this season is a large-scale work - Landscapes Dedicated to Zhu Xingfu by Shen Zhou, who was one of the greatest literati masters of the fifteenth century. With a total length of almost 14 meters, the depicted landscape is meticulously rendered with expressive simple brush strokes, while the fine calligraphy demonstrates the artist's superb skills and dexterity.

An additional highlight is Drinking Cards with Illustrations of Daoist Immortals by Ren Xiong, a prolific artist who revolutionised traditional Chinese painting within his abbreviated career.



The album of forty-eight leaves is the last surviving masterpiece of the artist's drinking card series, and presents the viewer with an amusing interplay between text and image, which provides wit and humour to festive gatherings. Due to his short career as an artist, works such as these 经

are extremely rare and highly sought after.

Another exciting highlight is Preface to the Orchid Pavilion by Bada Shanren, which was once owned by Zhang Dagian (1899-1983). During 1955 exhibition in Tokyo, Zhang sold the work to

Matsubayashi Keigetsu (1876-1963), who was a prominent Nanga-style painter during Meiji, Taisho and early Showa periods. Matsubayashi was a receiver of many accolades during his time, including his appointment as an imperial court painter in 1944 and receiver of the Japanese Cultural order award in 1958.

Coinciding with the centenary of **Wu Guanzhong**'s birth, this season's sales will present a special selection of the artist's works, including *The Grand Canyon*, which is from a private collection in North America. *The Grand Canyon* was part of London's British Museum's ground-breaking 1992 exhibition and only one of three versions painted by the artist.

The work reflects the artist's newfound vitality during this period, as he effortlessly moved between two styles, embracing both the free-flowing line of early-Qing artist Gong Xian and the rapid brushstrokes of Post-Impressionist Henri Matisse. The multiplying and tangling of different brush lines epitomises Wu's distress between two contradictory styles, as he strove to achieved a completely new artistic language.

Leading this season's sales of Chinese is painting is the impressive work *Retreat in the Bamboo Grove* by **Zhang Daqian**, which comes from an important Asian Private collection.

An electrifying vision of scintillating hues of green and blue, *Retreat in the Bamboo Grove* sits amongst the most monumental splashed-colour works that epitomise the triumphant outburst of creative energy in the artist's final years.

By depicting an idyllic retreat with effortless technical prowess, Zhang Daqian demonstrates a spectacular synthesis of pictorial languages that firmly places him as one of the greatest artists of the twentieth century.

A further highlight of the sale is the large-scale work *Waterfalls of Lake Jingpo* by modern ink master Fu Baoshi. The work is the artistic culmination of the artist's journey to Northeast China in the early-1960s, where Lake Jingpo is located. The focal point of the painting is the six-foot giant waterfall which flows into the lake below, appearing to embody the philosophical saying: "thunder, the sound of the valley". Overall, the spectacular composition is representative of Fu's mastery over the traditional ink and brush.

CONTEMPORARY INK PAINTINGS

Contemporary ink artists continue to draw upon historical artistic wisdom by reinterpreting traditional painting techniques and applying a unique perspective to their creations. Several works on offer this season beautifully embody this practice, including **Scholar's Rock** by **Liu Dan**, where we see the artist's finest, most virtuosic study of a scholar's rock. Suffused with subtle inflections of light and shadow dancing a cross the composition the work reveals a microscopic view into the wider universe. In **Roof of the World Series No. 5** by **Liu-kuo-Sung**, the artist portrays a majestic mountain range, by






combining technical mastery with an experimental use of materials, to create an atmospheric "portrait" of snowy jagged mountains. In *Rising Mountain* by **Li Huayi**, the artist uses a range of techniques to create towering mountain forms that appear hauntingly disquiet. In this composition, Li paints a personal and philosophical dialogue between man and nature - a dialogue that is intricately linked to many Chinese literati painters who came before him.



EXQUISITE EYE: CHINESE PAINTINGS ONLINE

As part of the Hong Kong week sales, Christie's presents **Exquisite Eye: Chinese Paintings Online**. This season the sale is led by the Chinese paintings and calligraphy collection assembled by **Eileen and I.M. Pei**, which features numerous works collected by the couple and personally gifted to them. Also on offer is a selection of paintings and calligraphy ranging from classical to modern to contemporary periods, notable artists include **Zhu Qizhan**, **Xie Zhiliu**, **Li Yanshan**, **Koo Mei**, and **Lui Shou Kwan**.

Also on offer is a selection of works by artists such as **Pan He** and **Lin Zhimian** from **The Collection of Huang Xiayi**, who was an important political figure Guangdong during the Republican period. This sale also features a collection of calligraphic couplets by literati members and important calligraphers of the late imperial period. This dedicated online auction offers emerging and seasoned collectors a unique opportunity to acquire paintings from distinguished private collections from Hong Kong, Japan, Southeast Asia, Australia and North America.
