### A DREAM REALISED: KANGXI'S ULTIMATE FALANGCAI BOWL

Leading this season's sales is an Extraordinary Imperial Ruby Red-Ground Falangcai 'Double Lotus' Bowl.

This exquisite imperial bowl represents the pinnacle of *falangca*i art during the Kangxi period. The Kangxi Emperor's dream of perfecting local production of painted enamels achieved extraordinary realisation with this exceptional and unique 'double lotus' bowl.

From its shape, enameling and decoration, the current bowl was made towards the end of the Kangxi reign, possibly in his last year in 1722, the period when *falangcai* production reached its perfection.

Through the ages, the bowl has been part of some of the most outstanding private collections across the world. Its fascinating journey began as part of the collection of Alfred Trapnell (1838-1917), an English collector and former sea captain.

#### **IMPORTANT CHINESE CERAMICS AND WORKS OF ART**

Leading this sale is A Fine Magnificent and Important Blue And White 'Boys' Jar And Cover from the Jiajing period. The jar is a technical masterpiece, groundbreaking for its time given its large size, depicted with a range of complex scenes. Additionally, its overall design would have been extremely difficult and costly to fire successfully.

Only four other Jiajing boys jars complete with a cover are known to exist, with the current jar and its companion piece being the only two in private hands. It comes to auction with compelling provenance, formerly being in the illustrious collection of J.M. Hu (1910-1993) and the prominent Hong Kong collector T.T. Tsui (1940-2010).

A further highlight in this sale is **An Important and Very Rare Copper-Red Decorated 'Three Fish' Stem Cup from the Xuande period.** Previously in the pre-eminent collections of Edward T. Chow and T.Y Chao, this stem cup is exceptionally rare, and is the only example in private hands of this size and shape. There is only one other know example in existence, which resides in the National Palace Museum in Taipei.
