

### Handbags & Accessories 27 November

Handbags & Accessories totalled HK\$45,863,125 / US\$5,942,915, and was 96% sold by lot and 98% sold by value.

A world auction record was achieved by the top lot: A RARE, MATTE WHITE HIMALAYA NILOTICUS CROCODILE RETOURNÉ KELLY 25 WITH PALLADIUM HARDWARE, HERMÈS, 2019, which sold for HK\$3,375,000 / US\$437,330.



Important Watches Including The Ruby Collection and An Important Private Asian Collection Part V 28 November

Important Watches Including The Ruby Collection and An Important Private Asian Collection Part V\_totalled HK\$145,341,250 / US\$18,833,227, and was 75% sold by lot and 83% sold by value.

The top lot of the sale was a PATEK PHILIPPE. A FANTASTICALLY WELL PRESERVED 18K WHITE GOLD AUTOMATIC PERPETUAL CALENDAR WRISTWATCH WITH MOON PHASES REF. 3448, MANUFACTURED IN 1966, which realised HK\$9,250,000 / US\$1,198,609, setting a new auction record for the reference.



### Magnificent Jewels 29 November

Magnificent Jewels totalled HK\$398,610,000 / US\$51,651,632, and was 77% sold by lot and 80% sold by value.

The top lot of the sale was a **BOGHOSSIAN EMERALD AND DIAMOND DOUBLE RIVIÈRE NECKLACE**, **DESIGNED BY EDMOND CHIN**, which realised **HK\$54,250,000 / US\$7,029,681**, and broke the record for no-oil Columbian emeralds.

### Important Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art 30 November

The four Chinese Works of Art sales realised a combined total of HK\$323,363,750 / US\$41,922,755.









The Chang Wei-Hwa Collection of Archaic Jades – Xia, Shang and Western Zhou Dynasties totalled HK\$46,240,000 / US\$5,994,822, and was 100% sold by lot and value. The top lot for the sale was A HIGHLY IMPORTANT INSCRIBED 'MARQUIS MI' WHITE JADE GE-HALBERD BLADE, which realised HK\$6,490,000 / US\$841,401 (left).

Inspiring The Mind – Life of A Scholar-official totalled HK\$116,196,250 / US\$15,064,357, and was 75% sold by lot and 81% of value. Top lot of the sale was A MAGNIFICENT AND EXTREMELY RARE CARVED ZITANHEXAGONAL TABLE, which achieved HK20,650,000 / US\$2,677,185 (second left).

Imperial Glories from The Springfield Museums Collection totalled HK\$54,200,000 / US\$7,026,803, and was 100% sold by lot and value. The top lot of the sale was A MAGNIFICENT AND EXCEPTIONALLY RARE LARGE WHITE JADE CARVING OF SHOULAO AND DEER, which realised HK\$10,450,000 / USD\$1,354,799 (second right).

Important Chinese Ceramics and Works of Art totalled HK\$106,727,500 / US\$13,836,773, and was 63% sold by lot and 71% by value. The top lot of the sale was AN EXTREMELY RARE AND FINE LARGE DING 'LOTUS' BOWL, which realised HK\$27,850,000 / USD\$3,610,635 (right).

### Fine Chinese Modern and Contemporary Ink Paintings on 1 December Fine Chinese Paintings and Calligraphy on 2 December

The two Chinese Paintings sales realised a combined total of HK\$315,610,000 / US\$40,907,310.





Fine Chinese Modern and Contemporary Ink Paintings totalled HK\$201,146,250 / US\$26,071,265, and was 82% sold by lot and 90% by value. The top lot of the sale was Album of Flowers, Vegetables and Objects by Wu Changshuo, which realised HK\$18,250,000 / US\$2,366,265 (left).

Fine Chinese Classical Paintings and Calligraphy totalled HK\$114,463,750 / US\$14,836,045, and was 69% sold by lot and 93% by value. The top lot of the sale was Landscape and Calligraphy by Shen Zhou and Wen Zhengming, which realised HK\$26,650,000 / US\$3,454,199 (right).

Modern and Contemporary Art
Evening Sale, Sanyu: Goldfish & 20<sup>th</sup> Century: Hong Kong to New York Sale on 2 December
Morning and Afternoon Sessions on 3 December

The five sales realised a combined total of HK\$1,733,906,375 / US\$224,706,473.











The <u>Evening Sale</u> totalled **HK\$844,925,000 / US\$109,513,668** and was **96%** sold by lot and **91%** sold by value. The top lot of the sale was *Pink Chrysanthemums in a Basket* by **Sanyu**, which achieved **HK\$138,110,000 / US\$17,900,917** (top left).

The dedicated single-lot sale of <u>Goldfish</u> by **Sanyu** achieved **HK\$170,170,000** / **US\$22,056,326**, a new auction record for a painting depicting an animal subject by the artist (top right).

The Hong Kong leg of the 20th Century: Hong Kong to New York Sale totalled HK\$404,140,000 / US\$52,381,991 and was 100% sold by lot and value. The top lot of this session Agent Orange (In The Milky Lake) by Yoshitomo Nara, which achieved HK\$65,975,000 / US\$8,551,249 (bottom left).

The Morning Session totalled HK\$107,056,250 / US\$13,875,175, and was 92% sold by lot and 95% by value. The top lot of the sale was Les Couturières (Seam stresses at Work) by Nguyen Phan Chanh, which realised HK\$10,930,000 / US\$1,416,479 (bottom middle) and is a new auction record for the artist.

The <u>Afternoon Session</u> totalled HK\$207,615,125 / US\$26,905,987, and was 95% sold by lot and 98% by value. The top lot of the sale was **Boy with Fish No. 2** by **Liu Ye**, which realised HK\$15,850,000/ US\$2,054,089 (bottom right).



A Wonderful Domaine de la Romanée-Conti Collection & Finest & Rarest Wines and Spirits Including A Magnificent Collection of Karuizawa 5 December

The two sales realised a combined total of **HK\$46,153,625** / **US\$5,980,570** 

A Wonderful Domaine de la Romanée-Conti Collection totalled HK\$20,545,000 / US\$2,662,214 and was 100% sold by lot and value. The top lot of the sale was 3 bottles of Domaine de la Romanée-Conti, Romanée-Conti 2007, which realised HK\$562,500 / US\$72,888 (left).

Finest & Rarest Wines and Spirits Including A Magnificent
Collection of Karuizawa totalled HK\$25,608,625 / US\$3,318,356 and
was 96% sold by lot and 98% sold by value. The top lot of the sale was 2
double magnums of Château Lafleur 1982, which realised HK\$625,000
/ US\$80,987.
